#### **Joint Orders**

The following Joint Order:

H.P. 719

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Special Legislative Oversight Committee for Regional Electricity Issues be established as follows.

- Sec. 1. Committee established. The Special Legislative Oversight Committee for Regional Electricity Issues, referred to in this order as the "committee," is established.
- Sec. 2. Committee membership. The committee consists of 13 members appointed as follows:
- 1. Four members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- 2. Nine members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House.
- Sec. 3. Chairs. The first named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair.
- Sec. 4. Appointments. All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this order. The appointments must be made so that no more than 8 members are of the same political party and the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy, the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources, the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development and the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary are represented. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall

call and convene the first meeting of the committee no later than 15 days after the final member is appointed.

- Sec. 5. Duties. The committee shall study and make recommendations concerning:
- 1. The design and operation of the New England regional electricity market:
- 2. The appropriate size and scope of a regional transmission organization to be created to serve the needs of Maine's consumers of electricity:
- The extent to which the State's consumers of electricity may be harmed by anticompetitive behavior in the energy market and ways the Legislature may act to protect consumers; and
- Related matters that the committee considers appropriate.
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of the Public Advocate shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee. In carrying out its duties, the committee may seek the expertise of the Public Utilities Commission, the Office of the Public Advocate, the Department of the Attorney General and any other appropriate state agency.
- Sec. 7. Compensation. Legislative members are entitled to receive legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the committee.
- Sec. 8. Reporting date established. The committee shall submit a report with recommendations and any accompanying legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy during the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature by January 15, 2002. Following the receipt of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy may report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature. If the committee requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

The Economic Development Incentive Commission, established by Public Laws 1997, Chapter 761, is pleased to present the enclosed report to you as required by 5 MRSA §13070-L. Over the two years since the Commission was appointed, we have worked with state agencies to develop and refine a uniform business reporting format which has provided the State with extensive data regarding the benefits received by businesses participating in the economic development incentive programs under the Commission's jurisdiction. The Commission sponsored an educational forum on economic development incentives with presentations by national experts in the field and contracted with an economist from the University of Maine for an independent analysis of the impact of economic development incentives on job growth.
