ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Joint Select Commission to Examine the Laws Governing the Operation of Emergency Vehicles is established as follows.

- Commission established. The Joint Select Commission to Examine the Laws Governing the Operation of Emergency Vehicles, referred to in this order as the "commission," is established.
- 2. Membership. The commission consists of 11 members appointed as follows.
 - A. The President of the Senate shall appoint 2 members from the Senate. One must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and the other must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation.
 - B. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 6 members from the House of Representatives as follows:
 - (1) One must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice;
 - (2) One must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation;
 - (3) At least one must have experience in the field of emergency medical services:
 - (4) At least one must have experience in the field of fire service; and
 - (5) At least one must have experience in the field of law enforcement.
 - C. The Governor, after consulting with the Commissioner of Public Safety, shall appoint 3 members as follows:

- (1) One must have experience in the field of emergency medical services:
- (2) One must have experience in the field of fire service; and
- (3) One must have experience in the field of law enforcement.
- 3. Chairs. The first Senate member named is the Senate chair and the first House member named is the House chair.
- 4. Appointments; convening commission. All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this order. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 60 days following the effective date of this order.
- 5. Duties. The commission shall review any necessary changes to laws governing the operation of emergency vehicles, including, but not limited to, the use of emergency lights, the general operation of emergency vehicles and the training of operators of emergency vehicles.
- Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission.
- 7. Compensation. Members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the commission.
- 8. Report. The commission shall submit a report along with any recommended legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation no later than January 2, 2002. Following receipt of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation may introduce legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature. If the commission requires an extension of time to make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
- 9. Commission budget. The chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its approved budget.

Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the Executive Director's designee shall provide the commission chair and staff with a status report on the study budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.
