In Senate Chamber Tuesday May 1, 2001

Senate called to order by President Michael H. Michaed of Penobscot County.

Prayer by Reverend Susan Crane of the First Baptist Church in Gardiner.

REVEREND CRANE: Grace to you and peace on this beautiful Spring morning. I am fascinated by the study of leadership. I read as much as I can about the practice and theory of leadership. Here is a book that I can wholeheartedly recommend to you. It's called Synchronicity by Joseph Jaworski. The book definitely plows some new ground and calls us to develop a radically different perspective about what we are doing and who are being when we serve as leaders.

In addition to serving as the interim pastor of a local church, I am also charged with the responsibility of advocating for women in ministry here in Maine, at least among American Baptists. What I often run into is churches who don't think they're ready for a woman pastor. It's almost as if they would rather do without than risk doing something they've never done before.

Surely as Senators in this wonderful State of Maine, you also run across people who would much rather cling to the past than venture forth into a brave new future. Yet the world around us is changing so fast we dare not dig in our heels for too long. People need leaders who will help them dream new dreams and realize new realities. Maybe that's what you and I have in common. Our role as servant leaders, on the threshold of a new era. How we collectively exercise our leadership gifts and powers in the present will have a profound effect on the future that we're all trying to bring into being. In an essence, leadership is about learning to shape the future. It's not about positional power. It's not about accomplishments. It's ultimately not even about what we do. Leadership is about creating a domain in which human beings continually deepen their understanding of reality and become more capable of participating in the unfolding of the world.

Ultimately, leadership is about creating new realities. Jaworski would say we do this best collectively. By collectively opening ourselves to all the possibilities and then working together to help the very best possibilities become the new reality. The future is not fixed. We do live in a world of possibilities and as helpless and hopeless as we sometimes feel in the face of overwhelming problems and limited resources, Jaworski invites us to believe into being the very best future we can imagine.

Will you join me in a moment of prayer. Oh Holy One, in whom we live and move and have our being, we thank You for the gift of life itself, for the beauty of this piece of earth we call Maine, and for the wonder of the human story. While we do not fully understand Your ways, Lord, we are grateful that life unfolds beneath our feet, even as we move forward into an unknown future. There are no road maps, God, but we trust that You go

before us to open a way, even where no way seems to be. We pray for the courage to address the challenges before us as we seek to serve all the people of Maine. Keep us mindful of those who need us to advocate for them, the children and the elderly, single parents, the homeless, and the disabled. Where interests conflict, help us listen with respect and seek to work things together for the good of all. Where hope seems dim, help us to trust in powers beyond our own. By Your grace may we see the possibilities for new life in every situation that we address today so the world will be a better place tomorrow for the leadership we give this day. Amen.

JOINT RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING MAY FIRST AS COLONEL JOHN ALLAN, AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR HERO, DAY WHEREAS, Colonel John Allan, Scottish-born patriot of the Revolutionary War, was appointed by President George Washington in 1776 as the Military Commander of the Eastern Area: and

WHEREAS, the Continental Congress in 1778 acknowledged the work of Colonel Allan in defending the District of Maine; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Allan had headquarters in Machias, Maine and defended the country during the Revolutionary War; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Allan united the Passamaquoddy, Maliseet, Penobscot and Micmac tribes with the Maine settlers and together they defended the Maine coast against the British; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Allan worked to fulfill promises made to the Passamaquoddy Tribe by meeting with President Washington and the Continental Congress; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Allan's service to the American colonies kept the area from the St. Croix River to the Penobscot River from becoming Canadian territory; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That, We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twentieth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize Colonel John Allan as a Patriot of Maine and we proclaim that May 1st, 2001 is Colonel John Allan Day; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to Porter Memorial Library in Machias, Peavey Memorial Library in Eastport, the Charlotte Historical Society, the Dennysville Historical Society, the Pembroke Historical Society, the Passamaquoddy Tribe and the Daughters of the American Revolution, who maintain the historical memorials in honor of this important time in Maine history.
