THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Abromson.

Senator ABROMSON: Thank you, Mr. President. The only difference between the Minority and the Majority report on L.D. 1736 relates to whether the Director of Consumer Credit Regulation should be confirmed by the legislature. Under the new management organizational chart that has been set up in the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, the only position that is presently still confirmed by the committee is the Director of Consumer Credit Regulation, which is range 88. The other range 88's are the Securities Administrator and the Director of Licensing and Registration. All those range 88 positions are no longer confirmed by the legislature. I don't think it's necessary. The Governor appoints the Commissioner. The Superintendent of Banking and the Superintendent of Insurance are also gubernatorial appointments. The Commissioner then appoints the Securities Administrator and the Director of Licensing and Registration. The only out-layer here is the Director of Consumer Credit Regulation and that's an aberration that is not necessary. I would urge the Majority Ought to Pass report.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator LaFountain.

Senator LAFOUNTAIN: Thank you, Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I rise this morning to encourage to support the Minority Ought to Pass as Amended report. The difference between these two reports is one issue only. For the most part, this bill, L.D. 1736, is a housekeeping bill. The issue really comes down to whether or not the Director of the Office of Consumer Credit Regulation should continue to be a confirmable position or not. The amendment brought forward at the work session was a last minute amendment proposed by the Commissioner, herself, who wanted to see that position go to a non-confirmable position. It's the belief of the minority that this is an important position that should have some sort of legislative oversight. For most of you in this chamber today, you know that throughout the course of this session you go down to Appropriations and you work with the Appropriations Committee on the various budgets that are coming from your policy area. Banking and Insurance is not one of those. We have made no appearances before Appropriations. We have very little oversight into the Bureau of Banking and Insurance and the Office of

Consumer Credit. We believe that this is one area where we, as a policy making committee, and the entire legislature should have some oversight and that is the position of Director. It's a system that has worked well. To my knowledge, we've never refused to confirm anyone who's been proposed for that position. For those reasons I encourage you to continue the policy of allowing the committee and this legislature to have oversight in confirming that position. Thank you.
