And You will be here when we no longer are, but others in our place, as committed as we are to do the people's work. You, who are the very spirit of the best that we intend and hope and do. When we are frenzied, calm us. When we are tired or overwhelmed, strengthen us. When we achieve victories, let us glory not in our own brilliance but in the triumph of a system which enables us to settle differences with words and not weapons. When we are tempted to believe that they are adversaries who will not see things our way, keep us mindful of what brought us all here, our common commitment to our state, our people and to that which is good and right and just. Let that always be our goal, oh lover and holder of goodness and righteousness and justice. Amen.

I rise to tell you that I've learned a great deal in the past few months and the one thing that I've learned regarding this bill is that when nobody shows up in opposition to something, it doesn't necessarily mean that everything is okay. My good friend, Representative Buck, brought me this bill and I did my best to work it. I realize in hindsight that it does not do all the things we want it to do. So I urge you to join my good friend, the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Rotundo, in Indefinitely Postponing this. Thank you.

The Chair noted the absence of the Senator from Cumberland, Senator ABROMSON, the Senator from Aroostook, Senator KNEELAND, and the Senator from Cumberland, Senator PENDLETON and further excused the same Senators from today's Roll Call votes.

Senator ROTUNDO: Thank you, Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I would like to speak to my motion if I might. As I went door-to-door seeking election to this wonderful body, there was no issue that was of greater concern to my constituents than health care. I think we, in the Senate, need to be concerned about health care for all and I think it's very unfair for us to be increasing our benefits when there are so many people in our own districts that do not have health care. I hope you will join me in Indefinitely Postponing this bill. Thank you.
