WHEREAS, under Private and Special Law, 1850, chapter 389, the 30th Maine Legislature approved "An Act to Incorporate the City of Calais," with the city's first sitting council and mayor meeting on April 14, 1851; and

WHEREAS, as early as 1760, it was reported that a small group of men paddled up the St. Croix River to the head of its tidewater to fish. Later, upon hearing news of the abundance of pine timber, fish and game in the area and reports that the river was navigable for large vessels, the first permanent settler, Daniel Hill, built a cabin. Soon Mr. Hill was followed by other settlers, establishing a settlement upon land in the area of Ferry Point; and

WHEREAS, officially recognized as Township No. 5 upon being granted by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to Waterman Thomas in 1789, incorporated as a town in 1809 and incorporated as a city in 1850, Calais is located at the extreme eastern end of Washington County, in the heart of the St. Croix River Valley; and

WHEREAS, the name of the French city, Calais, was likely borrowed for this city in Maine, since it lies opposite Dover Hill in New Brunswick. The St. Croix River forms the national boundary between Maine and New Brunswick; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calais is the 5th busiest port of entry to the United States on the Canadian border; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calais has become a cosmopolitan community and an ideal location for a "Two-Nation Vacation."

The warm relationship that exists between Calais and its border neighbors is recognized each year with an International Festival held during August; and

WHEREAS, the city and citizens of Calais support a large public recreation program, offering year-round activities to participants of all ages and abilities; and

WHEREAS, the city is the site of the St. Croix Island International Historic Site. The site, maintained by the National Park Service in cooperation with the Canadian Government, provides boat access to the St. Croix River; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government also maintains the Moosehorn National Wildlife Refuge in Calais. The refuge consists of more than 23,000 acres and is a breeding ground for migratory birds and other wildlife; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twentieth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, extend our best wishes to the good citizens of the City of Calais as they observe the city's sesquicentennial year; and be it further;

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Mayor of the City of Calais on behalf of the citizens of that community.

Senator NUTTING: Thank you, Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. This proposed amendment is an amendment to a bill I filed this session concerning the Workers' Comp Advocate System. There is also ongoing a study about the whole Workers' Comp System. I support that study. I believe we voted for that study a little bit earlier today. I hope that there will be some changes brought about and some increased efficiencies come about because of this study. I'm pretty sure that's going to happen. My problem is that in the last year, unfortunately, the number of Workers' Comp cases in Maine has been on the increase. We have done a great job in promoting safety in this state in the last year. Unfortunately, due to low unemployment and a whole host of other reasons, the number of cases going through our Workers' Comp System have gone way up again. Our ten Workers' Comp Advocates are swamped. They are having to do their own clerical work several hours a day. That's not letting them represent injured workers as they should. What I'm proposing to do with this amendment is to just say that, on a temporary basis while this study is ongoing, we would get them some temporary clerical help so the advocates can do what they were hired to do and that is represent injured workers. I think, in practical terms, this is the only help most injured workers are going to have through the system. If I am fortunate enough to get this amendment adopted, I then have to go on, of course, and repeal amendment S-189 that's on there now. But I'm getting ahead of myself. I hope that you can support this amendment. I'm just trying to tide the advocates over until the study can bring about increased efficiencies and get them help from other areas in the Workers' Comp System that probably aren't being run quite as efficiently as they should be. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Edmonds.

Senator **EDMONDS**: Thank you, Mr. President. I just wanted to join the good Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting, in encouraging you to vote for this amendment. The need for

advocates is imperative in the Workers' Comp System and to give them the clerical support they need is also important. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner.

Senator **TURNER**: Thank you, Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. Normally when I rise after Senator Edmonds speaks, I'm usually speaking in opposition to her point of view. In this case, I'm asking that you join me in voting for this particular amendment. I do believe that we have suspicion and strong evidence that says that the workers' advocates system, while working, is overloaded and needs a good one time shot in the arm. This amendment from Senator Nutting will do that. So I would urge you to vote in his favor. Thank you very much.
