In Senate Chamber Friday June 8, 2001

Senate called to order by President Michael H. Michaud of Penobscot County.

Prayer by Senator Paul T. Davis, Sr. of Piscataguis County.

SENATOR DAVIS: Good morning, colleagues. What a beautiful day it is today. I have been besieged with requests to pray for all of us, individually and as a group. However, I think I will stick to my text.

The Maine State Senate, I have found, is a marvelous place. It was shown clear the other day when we debated, no less than 22 of us stood and debated some numerous times, and it was a bit contentious at times, and yet within three minutes after the debate, we were all laughing and still good friends. God bless America. In thinking of that, I thought about the prayers that we give here each morning. It stirred my memory to something I read about Benjamin Franklin. In 1787, he addressed the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia. He talked about prayer. I want to read to you what he had to say.

'In the beginning of the contest with Britain, when we were sensible of danger, we had daily prayers in this room for divine protection. Our prayers were heard and they were graciously answered. All of us who were engaged in the struggle must have observed frequent instances of a superintending providence in our favor. Have we now forgotten this powerful friend or do we imagine we no longer need His assistance? I have lived a long time and the longer I live the more convincing proofs I see of this truth, that God governs in the affairs of men. And if a sparrow cannot fall to the ground without His notice, is it probable that an empire can arise without His aid? We have been assured, Sir, in the sacred writings that except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it. I firmly believe this. I also believe that without His concurring aid we shall succeed in this political building no better than the builders of Babel. We shall be divided by our little local interests. Our projects will be confounded. And we, ourselves, shall become a reproach and a byword down to future ages. And what is worse, mankind may, hereafter, from this unfortunate instance despair of establishing government by human wisdom and leave it to chance, war, or conquest. Therefore, I beg leave to move that, henceforth, prayers imploring the assistance of Heaven and its blessings on our deliberation be held in this assembly every morning before we proceed to business.

Mr. Franklin stated that well. Let us pray. Heavenly Father, we humbly ask that You will bless us with wisdom and courage as we lend our efforts for the betterment of the people of the State of Maine. Help us to use our authority with caution and our positions with humility. By Your grace, Lord, may fairness and respect govern our efforts. In Jesus' name. Amen.
