**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Treat.

Senator TREAT: Good morning, men and women of the Senate. It is my honor today to have here with us in the Senate someone who himself has been honored with the highest honor in football in the State of Maine. We're all familiar with the Heisman Trophy. Well Maine has it's own Heisman Trophy and it's the James J. Fitzpatrick Trophy. This year that award went to Lee St. Hilaire, who is a Winthrop High School Senior. He is here with his coach, Norm Thombs, of Winthrop High School. Lee is the first ever non-Class A school winner of the award. Winthrop is a Class C school. In fact, it's kind of interesting that he's the first player outside of the Western Class A to ever the win the award since Gardiner High School's Nate Sargent won 1997, which just happens to be another school that I represent here in the Legislature. Just some statistics, which may mean something to some of you who are more into football than I am, Lee threw 2,129 yards and 18 touch downs this season. Over his career of 4 years, he threw 8,019 yards and made 84 touch downs and had a completion record of over 63%. I can just tell you, as someone that isn't really the biggest football fan in the world, I went to a number of these games and they were truly exciting games. His individual numbers are only part of the picture. The Winthrop team itself, as you may know, won the Class C State Championship in 2000, and the Western Class C title in 1999 and in 2000. Lee has posted a record of 36 - 7 over his 4 years,

including a 22 game winning streak during 2001 and 2000. So, as you can see, he is someone who really deserves to be honored. I had breakfast with Lee over at the Governor's house this morning and I will attest that he is polite, hard working, respected by the entire community, his coaches, teachers and fellow classmates. I would like you to join me in recognizing Lee St. Hilaire as well as his coach, Norm Thombs, who are here in the back of the room and to extend the legislative sentiment.
