# JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF DUANE "BUZZ" D. FITZGERALD

WHEREAS, it is with great sadness that we have received the news of the death of Duane "Buzz" D. Fitzgerald, former Chief Executive Officer of Bath Iron Works, after a battle with brain cancer; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Fitzgerald was a native of St. John, son of a shipbuilder and a graduate of Morse High School in Bath and attended Boston University, where he earned 3 degrees, including one in law and one in business; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Fitzgerald practiced law for 23 years, including a stint as Bath Iron Works outside counsel, and in 1987 he joined Bath Iron Works as executive vice president; and

WHEREAS, in 1988, Mr. Fitzgerald became president and chief operating officer of Bath Iron Works and 3 years later became the firm's chief executive officer; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Fitzgerald deeply loved his family, his company and the State of Maine and was known for his integrity, loyalty and his deep commitment to his ideals; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Fitzgerald served the people of Maine in many ways and contributed much to his community. In the final months of his illness, he continued to give and teach and exemplified all the best qualities of what Governor King called being a "pillar of the community"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twentieth Legislature, now assembled in the Second Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent take this opportunity to honor the memory of the respected career and life of Duane "Buzz" D. Fitzgerald and to pay our respects and extend our condolences to the family of this highly esteemed gentleman; and be it further
