Senator MCALEVEY: Thank you, Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I'll be very brief, but I just thought I should explain why we had a majority report. When we initially heard the bill last session, we heard some very horrendous horror stories and we were unable to get to the truth of the matter during that session, so we carried the bill over and we asked the participants, the department, the Counsel of Churches, the ACLU, and individuals who came forward with allegations of prisoners being beaten and chained to come forward in the this session with some data and proof. Though we had the hearing, they were not present with the information, so we postponed it again. We asked them to come forward and they did not. We can only work on truth. It's poor public policy to work on rumor and innuendo. The reality is 50 of those prisoners in that facility have been moved back into the regular prison. We've converted one section of that into a mental health unit. If I, or any members of our committee, hear of any abuse, and we have in the past, we've always brought it to the attention of the department. I haven't left it there; I've always followed through because I want answers. I hope if any of you have ever heard of any abuse, you would feel free to contact the department or contact me. As I have said in the past, I've been their strongest supporter, but I am also their strongest critic. Is everything perfect there? No. There is always room for improvement. But short of actual specifics, we didn't feel this bill had any merit and we will be glad to revisit it if anybody ever brings up a potential problem, because I want to know about potential problems and solve them. If something does happen that is inappropriate, I want to make sure the people responsible are held accountable and it doesn't happen again. But the people we charged with coming back with very specific testimony sat on their hands when they came back or did not show up again. We cannot deal with rumor or innuendoes, we have to deal in truth and facts. If the truth and facts are out there and people don't bring them forward, that's another matter. All of the members of the committee made it clear to the participants that if they didn't feel comfortable talking publicly they could approach committee members privately and we would keep their confidence. That did not happen either. Thank you very much.
