**THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Pendleton.

Senator **PENDLETON**: Thank you, Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. This particular appointment is a very

serious matter and it could profoundly affect some of the communities that are in my district. Mr. Douglas, who has been appointed to the District Court, has been the Legal Counsel for the Governor for the past several years. It would seem to me that a judge should have a feel for the community and the county that were are going to be holding court. I have nothing personally against Mr. Douglas and I'm sure he's a fine man and that he would do a fine job. However, I worry about the relationship between the cultural properties of the area and the people that are being served. A person in this position should be able to understand the culture, as far as it pertains to protective orders. criminal orders, and other community legal issues. It would seem to me that appointing someone who has not had experience or is not familiar with this particular area would undermine the nature of the District Court itself. I was always under the impression that the District Court was the peoples' court and in, order to feel that justice could be achieved, people would be appointed to serve the areas that they are familiar with. For those reasons, I will be voting against the committee's recommendation. I will also add that there were plenty of applicants for this position. I'm just wondering why we don't have more women in the District Court? Thank you for your time.

**THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Somerset, Senator Mills.

Senator MILLS: Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. in response to the last question about women, it should be noted that the Chief Justice of the Maine Supreme Court is a woman and the Chief Justice of the Superior Court is a women, to whom I'm related. The Chief Justice of the District Court is a women. I've been looking around for some t-shirts with the label 'Chicks Rule' for them. I might also suggest that never has the system operated quite so successfully and so smoothly, in my judgment as a consumer of those services as an attorney. I need also to remind the chamber that there has often been a precedent or a tradition that people appointed to represent the area where a District Court judge will serve be from outside the district. There is a very good reason for this. If you appoint someone who is from within the district, or who has practiced law within the district, you run into a firewall of conflicts during the first year or two that the judge serves because former clients, former opponents, or litigants may come before that judge. Even witnesses may crop up in trials who have either been represented by that judge when he or she was an attorney or there maybe some other impediment to the judge's successful service on a case and you could wind up with a great many recusals often times. So there is a real benefit, frankly, to having a judge appointed who has not had the experience of actually practicing law within the community that he will be serving. In fact, up until recently, many of the judges were circuit judges. The District Court judges served throughout the state. They were moved around guite a bit. That is less true now than it was formerly. But it is still true of the Superior Court, which does ride the circuit. All 16 of them travel all over the state. It is a benefit to the system, frankly, to have a judge sitting on a case who does not know the people who are in front of him, the witnesses, the defendants, the parties, or so forth. In response to the procedural question that was posed by the good Senator, I think that there is a distinct benefit to having an appointment made in this fashion. But I can't sit down without mentioning one more thing about the nominee whose qualifications are being placed before you. I sat through the hearing yesterday in which his

background and his qualifications were presented to the committee. I did not speak at the hearing, I simply listened. I was there strictly out of interest in the proceedings. It is safe to say that I have seldom heard a resume that more impressive than the one from Mr. Douglas. I think the main question most of the room had was why is he interested in serving on the District Court, why isn't he seeking an appointment to the Superior Court or the federal bench? He is a former clerk for Justice Wernick. who was one of the smartest people that ever served on the Maine Supreme Court 20 years ago. He then went on to the federal system and served as a clerk for Judge Edward Gignoux, who was one of the top Federal Judges in the United States, by everybody's reckoning. Those two judges were known for selecting clerks who had outstanding qualifications. From there he has had varied experience while working at Pierce Atwood on health law issues. He's appeared in the District Court as an attorney. He has, of course, in more recent years been the Governor's counsel, and in that capacity, has become exquisitely sensitive to the requirements of being a judge because he's had to assist the Governor in selecting nominees for the bench. truly think that he may be the most qualified person whose resume I've heard reviewed in the Judiciary Committee and I've sat through dozens and dozens of them in the last 10 years or so. That is all I have to say. Thank you.

Senator RAND: Thank you, Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I would urge you to vote to not override the Judiciary Committee's recommendation of Wayne Douglas. Wayne Douglas, I am fully confident that the State of Maine will be well served by having this individual on the bench. He, ultimately, received the Governor's support. So I would urge you to, please, vote with me so that the State of Maine can benefit by having Wayne Douglas in our court. Thank you.
