The SPEAKER: As you know, today Governor Francis was laid to rest in the Eastport area. I had the opportunity to attend the funeral, as did members of leadership from both the Republican and Democratic side of the aisle. It was a very touching and very loving tribute to Governor Francis. He obviously had many friends and had done many great works on behalf of others and his life, the summation of what was said about him, speaks volumes of the kind of people that we have here in the hall of the House. His life was largely made up of acts for others and most of what he did in his life was for someone else in need. Today, as we adjourn I would like everyone to reflect on that, because there is no greater tribute, especially watching and witnessing his funeral, in terms of what people said about him. What they will remember him for is what he did for his fellow men and women, both in the Tribe and in Washington County.

He had a very large family, made up primarily of foster children. He was a person who brought in kids who were coming from broken homes. The kids have made the best of their lives in large measure because of himself and his wife. In honor of what he meant to so many people in Washington County, the Chair understands that the Representative from Portland, Representative Cummings – at the request of the Representative from Calais, Representative Perry – moves that the House stand adjourned until Wednesday, January 18, 2006 at ten o'clock in the morning, in honor and lasting tribute to the memory of Tribal Governor Melvin Francis of the Passamaquoddy Tribe.

On motion of Representative CUMMINGS of Portland, at the request of the Representative from Calais, Representative PERRY, the House adjourned at 4:39 p.m., until 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, January 18, 2006 in honor and lasting tribute to "Chief" Governor Melvin Francis of the Passamaquoddy Tribe.
