Representative **MIRAMANT**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Men and Women of the House. Thanks for letting me take a couple of minutes. Mr. Twitchell wouldn't come today and that is just the nature of him and why he needs to be honored. He spent his time at that airport since he was a small boy and that has become a hub of the aviation community in Maine. It was for a long time, when aviation was thriving. We have seen a decline, but the community, it represents the community of Turner and that area, represents a community of aviation that stretches from Florida to Labrador, and east and west as well.

Twitchell's Seaplane Base, as well as the ground airport, were a hub of many journeys. Myself, I staged a trip to Québec to kayak a first river. We staged a trip to Memphremagog in Québec, right on the border, to look at the sea monster that they claim there. One of our reporters from Maine says he saw it, the *Providence Journal* claimed not to. But some interesting things. Everyday, a lot going on, but through it all, Mike's father died at that airport, serving these interests. We've supported the forest service and airflow planes, fire patrol everyday in the summer so we can get ahead of those fires. That's why we don't have many, because of our fire patrol service. Twitchell helped us support all of that. But in the heart of it, and why I want to speak, and why Mike is not here, is because he is a humble person with many gifts.

When I stumbled into Twitchell's Airport, I found a man not only willing to help his community by providing the things that I mentioned, but he became a mentor and teacher to many of us. Representative Hayes from Buckfield as well, has flown out of there. And Mike has a style of teaching you the common sense, helping you to understand what is important, knowing that you'll learn the rules as well. But doing it in a gentle and kind way, very thoroughly, and providing not just a whole package that every pilot should have, but that every person should have. A gentle, nurturing teacher, a kind and compassionate man, and a man who looks to help his community and the larger community with asking nothing from himself.

We all tried to get him here because I wanted you to meet him. He just won't take that kind of recognition, so I wanted to

say a few words. Thank you for your patience. Thank you, Mike Twitchell, and Turner's airport.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Buckfield, Representative Hayes.

Representative **HAYES**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. Mike Twitchell is one of the bravest men I have ever met. Mike got in a single engine plane with me and let me fly it. Now how many of you have taught a teenager how to drive? White knuckled, Mike does that with folks. At 40 years old I learned how to fly a plane because he was willing to take me up. I called it my "mental health break".

He is a wonderful man. He is an institution in Turner, Maine, as has been Twitchell's Airport. I'm proud to say that I have a private pilot's license. It was the hardest thing that I ever learned how to do. I said that before getting elected to here, multi-tasking at this level is now, I think, overcome learning how to fly a plane. I am pleased and very honored that Representative Miramant would think to initiate this sentiment, and proud that this institution would back that. I am hoping that Representative Sirois, from Turner, will join us when we travel to Turner to convey this sentiment in person. Thank you folks, very much, for your time.
