The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Fairfield, Representative Finch.

Representative **FINCH**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. Very briefly, you will notice on this that there are two reports. Both of them are Ought to Pass, and I would like to point out to the members, what the difference is in these two reports.

This deals with the issue of the dreaded, feared, local assessment system, which we have wrestled with in this state for the last few years. As it stands, funds for a local assessment system are what is known as targeted funds. Each district receives a certain dollar amount per student, and in order to receive these funds, the local district has to file a plan with the Commissioner as to how these funds would be spent.

The difference between the two reports is basically in two words. The Majority Report states that the plan to be submitted to the Commissioner must have the agreement of the local teacher's association; the Minatory Ought to Pass requires consultation with the local teacher's association. Those two words and the difference between those two words have a tremendous impact. If the Majority Report is enacted, it would mean that before a local district were to submit its report for these funds to the Commissioner, or its plan, there would have to be negotiations with and approval of the local teacher's association. In other words, the local teacher's association would have a veto over a part of the district budget.

Preparing of district budget has always been the purview of the local school board. In some districts, these are then submitted to a counsel for approval, in some districts to a voter approval, but at no time in a district has any aspect of a budget had to have the approval of the district employees. This would require that the plan have the approval of the teachers, therefore spending of the money and what it is spent on would have to have the approval of the teachers.

I know the local assessment system has been controversial; frankly it has been a mess. Some people said from the beginning that it was a disaster, but in this regard, I believe it is true across the state that school boards and teachers were in agreement that it was a disaster. This does nothing to eliminate the local assessment system anymore than what has already been done. But I feel that by giving employees a veto over budget preparation, over policy, and how that is to be spent, we are setting a very, very dangerous precedent. I hope that this will result in a red light on this particular motion, and a green light on acceptance of the Minority Report, which I stress, is exactly the same thing except for those two words. Thank you.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Dover-Foxcroft, Representative Annis.

Representative **ANNIS**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. The minute the employees start telling the employers what they want and what they should do, you have lost it all. As a former school board member and chair, this is a negotiable thing, and not something that the employees should demand of the employers. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Bangor, Representative Norton.

Representative **NORTON**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I agree there is a couple of words difference, but this bill certainly in no way says that teachers have to sign off on anything.

Again, this is for a very small—this is only the assessment piece that the rules ask that teachers be included in decisions around some of those local assessment pieces. There does not have to be a sign off, there does not have to be any such thing at all. It is that those step-by-step rules, particularly around local assessments, be developed and discussed with the local teachers. You need to check the language of both the Majority Report and the Minority Report, if you have a problem with that.

Again, it is because, partly because, of the mess we ran into with all of the local assessments, the double scoring and triple scoring, and all of those things. It does not do what the good

Representative from Fairfield says. Nobody has to sign off on anything.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Biddeford, Representative Casavant.

Representative **CASAVANT**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. First off before I even mention anything about this particular bill, let me state that I am a teacher. I hate learning results, absolutely hate learning results. The reason why I do is that because for so many times, it was top directed by people who had been out of education for so long that they did not really seem to know what was going on in the classrooms. At least this bill allows some teacher input. I mean we are the ones who are in the trenches; we are the ones that are engaged with the students on a day-to-day basis. To not have us involved in any type of approval or insight, I think is wrong.

In order to have good education, you have to have people who are engaged in teaching on a daily basis, not administrators per say, who are often outside the classroom and doing their thing, but people who are doing the nuts and bolts. Therefore, I think it is important if we are going to keep learning results—of course I would say probably I would get rid of them, but that is different—at least if we are going to do that, I think it is important to allow teacher input as much as possible. Thank you.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Caribou, Representative Edgecomb.

Representative **EDGECOMB**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I could not explain this more clearly than what Representative Finch has explained on this issue. When the vote is taken, I request a roll call vote.

Representative EDGECOMB of Caribou **REQUESTED** a roll call on the motion to **ACCEPT** the Majority **Ought to Pass** Report.

Representative **PERRY**: Mr. Speaker, I have been trying to find the language that is the issue between the bill and the amendment, and looking at the amendment and the bill itself, I cannot find the language. I would really like to see exactly what the language is and what the difference is.

The SPEAKER: The Representative from Calais, Representative Perry has posed a question through the Chair to anyone who may care to respond. The Chair recognizes the Representative from Fairfield, Representative Finch.

Representative **FINCH**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We can go back and forth here all day about what the bill does and does not say, however, the actual bill does not include the language because it is in rulemaking. I would hope that before the members vote, they would have a chance to see what the actual language is in the rule. It is my contention that it includes the word "agreement," there are those who might differ, so may I pose a question through the Chair?

The SPEAKER: The Representative may pose his question. Representative **FINCH**: Mr. Speaker, is there some way that this could be tabled so that members could receive a copy of the actual rules, so they could actually see the language for themselves?

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Vassalboro, Representative Browne.

Representative **BROWNE**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I would differ with the motion on the floor. I think this law deals with placement of signs for businesses, and it says right now it has to be within 1,000 feet of a telephone. For many businesses that is not a good position, a good location, but the Minority Ought to Pass as Amended Report says we are going to move this so that it is in the center of the business area, it is going to be on contiguous land, it is going to comply with all of the standards for the highway and town ordinances.

First of all, I would ask for a roll call, and secondly, I would ask you to oppose this motion. Thank you.

Representative BROWNE of Vassalboro **REQUESTED** a roll call on the motion to **ACCEPT** the Majority **Ought Not to Pass** Report.

More than one-fifth of the members present expressed a desire for a roll call which was ordered.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Ripley, Representative Thomas.

Representative **THOMAS**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. If you have something that you want to sell, we all know you are not going to

sell it if you do not let people know it is for sale. Signs are probably the most cost effective way for a business to let customers, potential customers know what they offer for sale, the business' service. The more business or the more items that a business is able to sell, the more people they are going to be able to employ, the more taxes they are going to pay, it is going to be good for all of us.

The placement for signs, letting customers know what you have for sale, is critical, it is important. We are only allowed so many signs in this state, and this bill does not do anything to increase the number of signs or increase the size of that sign. It only changes a regulation to make it a little bit more common sense that the sign must be within 1,000 feet of where the business in conducted, not 1,000 feet from the telephone. The telephone may have very little to do with where that business is conducted, and it would seem to me that we would want businesses to do as much as they can do, to employ as many people as they can. It is good for all of us, and so I would urge you to vote against this motion, and that we pass this bill so that businesses are allowed to advertise the goods and services they offer in a common sense way. Thank you.

Representative **MARLEY**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. Just a little background on this: This is my seventh year in the Legislature, and I think that every session we have had a bill on this. Unfortunately, while this is toted as a pro business bill, in past years—this year the only business that actually came and testified on behalf of this bill was in fact a company that sold signs, ironically enough—but in past years when people have come in, they have talked about how it actually would impact and negatively impact the State of Maine, the concerns around the billboard law in the State of Maine, and how Maine has that unique feel and that unique look to it. At that point, it really draws people to the state, either to live or to work here, or to spend their money here as they did this past weekend, over the Memorial Day weekend.

This law expands that and personally I believe the majority of the Committee that opposed this legislation had the same concerns, that it would be undoing something that is unique to Maine, that is unique to our economy, and there are other ways to address this. We talked about trying to, particularly something for small businesses, because I think those were the ones that we all were trying to help. In this case, what it really creates would be an unfair advantage for those larger businesses that can afford to buy land that abuts the highways, and put up these large signs. That is only going to take away, in my mind and I believe in others, that ability for people to come here and want to get that Maine experience, so I hope you will support the Ought Not to Pass motion.
