In Senate Chamber Tuesday February 13, 2007

Senate called to order by President Beth Edmonds of Cumberland County.

Prayer by Reverend Canon Henry A. Male, Jr., of Trinity Lutheran Church in South Paris.

REVEREND MALE: Just for a moment I want you to relax, please. President Edmonds, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I'm honored to be asked to come back with you this morning. I'm never quite sure how or why one is asked back, but I am back. It's either that I did a fine job the last time I was here and you really wanted me back or perhaps you can't remember. I hope it's not that. Who am I? I am a retired Episcopal priest, an Associate Ecumenical Officer for the Dioceses of Maine, and currently serving at the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America in South Paris, Maine. Since I was invited back I would suspect that it is something like being elected to be a Senator, I'm getting around to praying, or being reelected once again.

Let me tell you a story which may make sense when I finish. Remember I'm to be non-political, according to the letter, and non-sectarian in what ever I do today, so I feel talking about a young bride-to-be should be acceptable. This young lady learned that some of her fiancé's religious beliefs were less than standard. She asked her mother, 'What shall I do? George doesn't even believe in Hell.' The mother replied, 'Don't worry, dear, between the two of us we'll teach him.' At the wedding rehearsal the bride became nervous about her walk down the church's long aisle. Her mother reassured her, 'Don't worry, dear, you can get rid of any last minute jitters if you concentrate on three words. First think of 'aisle'. It's the same aisle you walked down every week since you were a little girl. Second, focus on the altar, the table. You were baptized at that table and have knelt before it every Sunday for years. Third, think about him, your loving groom, waiting to begin your new life together.' On the wedding day the mother's advise worked like a charm. The bride focused hard on the first word as she began her wedding march down the aisle. 'Aisle, aisle, aisle,' she repeated over and over again. Then she said, 'Altar, altar, altar.' Finally the third thing was, 'Him, him, him.' Finally when the procession ended and she was beside the groom she looked into his eyes and said, 'Aisle altar him later.'

Now what does that got to do with you? I think it has something to do with the Senators of Maine. When you first thought of running for the Senate, I'm sure you were very nervous about what your life ahead would be like. What would be expected of you? Those who elected you had preconceived ideas as to what they expected you to do. I suspect you also had preconceived ideas as well. With time things do change, as have you, and so has the job you took on. At times your constituents probably want to alter you because they differ with you. On many occasions you must likely have felt drawn into more than one

way, but the way you should be drawn is for the betterment of the people of Maine and not for the bride or the groom but what is best for all. Any sacred relationship, and I consider that is what you are in, in a sacred relationship with Maine, is a high calling. Let us pray.

God, You are called by many names by many people. May You, the source of all power, lend Your guidance and continue to be with each one of these Senators. May they continue to open to the truth in a non-partisan way even when they are forced to make a decision which may not be popular. May those decisions be ones of openness and truthfulness in respect of all they have been called to serve. This we ask in Your most powerful name.
