THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings.

Senator **HASTINGS**: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I wish to speak briefly to this bill. This bill, which is entitled 'A Bill to Protect the Solemnity and Dignity of a Funeral or Memorial Service in Maine', is a direct result of the threats that a group from Kansas made last March to protest the

funeral of Sergeant Corey Dan of Norway who was killed in Iraq. The group has been appearing at slain soldier's funerals around the country claiming with hateful signs that our soldiers are being killed as God's punishment for our nation's acceptance of homosexuality. Hateful speech. It is my belief, ladies and gentlemen, that a funeral, burial, or memorial service is only about family and friends grieving and saying good-bye to a loved one. It is no place for unwanted politics, protests, or unwanted communication. Whatever the notoriety surrounding the death or the funeral, the deceased is someone's mother, father, son, or daughter. The family deserves the right to mourn without disturbance and interference of politics, protests, or other hateful communication or any other unwanted communication. They deserve a bubble of protection.

Last spring we attempted to pass legislation, and I want to thank the Governor's Office for helping us on that, but we just weren't able to get it through in time for the funeral. We did submit the legislation we came up with at that time. The interest is clearly one of balancing the right of a family to mourn in peace and the right of freedom of speech. As Corey Dan's grandmother told me, Corey gave his life to protect our liberties and our right for freedom of speech. It was not their intent to prohibit protests. Their only goal was to give their family a small bubble of protection to greave in peace.

As we originally drafted this bill it was based on time and distance prohibitions. You couldn't protest, or make these hateful signs of protest, within so many hours before or after and so many feet from the funeral. Many states have developed laws like this and were discovering that trying to use time and distance prohibitions run afoul of First Amendment rights because every circumstance is different. Whatever distance you pick in some circumstances it is too much, it's more than is necessary to protect the family. If you pick a small distance that is felt would work in every case, then there are other cases where it won't work at all. With the help of the State Police and the Criminal Justice Committee, we took a different tack and that is the Amendment before you today. The bill at this point essentially adds to the disorderly conduct laws of this state a prohibition and creates the crime of knowingly insulting, taunting, or challenging any person with offensive, derisive, or annoying words or other physical conduct which would have a direct tendency to incite a violent response. As you know, these types of hateful protests do incite many violent responses. How many people, friends of the family, say, 'I wish I could just go over and knock their head off and I'd do it if I could.' The State Police has told us this language would give them what they need to protect a funeral. The Maine Civil Liberties Union, which initially was concerned about the time and distance, has told us they are comfortable with this language from a Constitutional point of view.

Ladies and gentlemen, for the benefit of all Mainers, and it's not just slain soldiers because it maybe a heinous criminal, but whatever the circumstances let's be sure that the family and friends of that deceased person can mourn and say good-bye to their loved one in peace. Ladies and gentlemen, I urge your support and vote in favor of the pending motion. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Strimling.

Senator **STRIMLING**: Thank you, Madame President. May I pose a question through the Chair?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose his question.

Senator **STRIMLING**: Thank you, Madame President. To anyone who may know the particulars, in reading the amendment it seems pretty clear in terms of whether you are making noise or whether you are doing something demonstrative in some way that can really distract. Does it in any way restrict a somebody's right to have a poster that says whatever it is they say. I'm just trying to get a question of, if they are still allowed to put it on a piece of paper and hold it up if they want to, they just can't verbally or physically accost.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Cumberland, Senator Strimling poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Hastings.

Senator HASTINGS: Thank you, Madame President. It is my belief it does not have to be a verbal taunt. A poster would fall within the definition of what is prohibited. The goal here is to protect that family from this unwanted communication, whether it be in print or verbal or some other form. A law similar to this has been challenged in Kentucky in a federal court. It was a law that had a time and distance prohibition. The court found that a family does have an interest to be protected from unwanted communications at the funeral. They just said the time and distance things were too difficult to enforce and in that particular case extended beyond what was necessary. This is much like another section in the law on disorderly conduct, which already makes it a crime to make offensive gestures and taunts that would incite the physical reaction. That's what this is aimed at. It's keeping the peace. The violent reaction, that becomes the result of these taunts, is the interest that the state has in protecting against. Obviously, I think that even a sign can incite that violent reaction and under this statute would be prohibited.
