**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Dow.

Senator **DOW**: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I rise in opposition to the minority report. Looking at the calendar you will see that 8 members are on the Ought Not to Pass. What this bill is about is taking a Class C crime and making it a civil offense. That is what I object to, whether it is a marine bill or whatever it is. I want to start this bill out by saying that this isn't a contest between the Senator from

Hancock, Senator Damon, and myself. We sit right beside each other on committee and help move that committee along. Many times I get the feeling that I'm a little bit more helpful than some of the members of his own Party. We have a great relationship on that committee. This isn't anything to do with a contest between him and myself, it just has to do with a difference of opinion on law. As I was saying, this changes a Class C crime, which must be proved in a court of law with a jury, to a criminal offense where you only need 51% of the proof to find guilt. That is the objection I have, whether it's a marine bill or any kind of bill. Let's define what molestation is. Molestation of lobster traps is just the terminology for picking up your own trap and getting the lobsters out of it or picking up somebody else's trap or cutting it or stealing from it or doing anything else to it that could be illegal. It is still a major crime. It's a Class C. It's not a Class D crime. Some of these laws were revamped years ago and this particular one was left as a Class C crime. It wasn't downgraded to a Class D crime like some others were. The results of a jury trial with a finding of quilty for molesting a trap is that the Commissioner can take a person's lobster license away for 3 years. A Class C crime of \$1,000 or \$2,000 all of a sudden becomes a \$300,000 fine and a loss of livelihood. That's okay if it's a Class C crime and it has been proven in a court of law by a jury without any doubt. To move it to a civil law offense, the penalties are still the same. You have to pay back any damage plus you are going to lose your license for 3 years and therefore lose your livelihood. The fine isn't going to be \$1,000 and a few months in jail, but will be \$300,000, assuming they make \$100,000 a year, and the loss of livelihood. They won't be able to pay the payments on their boat. They will lose that. That's why I object to this bill and that's how I was able to convince most of the members of the Marine Resources Committee to vote against this. I guess I'm done. Thank you very much.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting.

Senator **NUTTING**: Thank you, Madame President. L.D. 1506 was a bill that I did present to the Education Committee. I'm not holding great hopes of turning an 11 - 2 report, but on the other hand I can't resist putting some comments on the record. We have all struggled and I think for the next 6 weeks, I hope it's just for the next 6 weeks, we'll struggle with school funding issues. I know in Minnesota and Wisconsin they do school funding there based similar to what I proposed in L.D. 1506. What L.D. 1506 does is repeals the EPS school funding formula. What it does is take approximately \$50 million of new school funding money that the 110 minimum receivers in Maine have got for increases in the

last 2 years and puts that money into the property poor areas of Maine. If you support continuing to put new additional school funding money into districts that do the whole school budget on 4, 5, or 6 mils, then you will support the pending motion. Representing an areas of Maine as I do that has to raise between 14 and 18 mils to their budget, I can't, in good conscience, support the pending motion. I would urge you to oppose the pending motion. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **GOOLEY** of Franklin, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Somerset, Senator Mills.

Senator MILLS: Thank you, Madame President and men and women of the Senate. I have often joined with the good Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting, on many causes relating to school funding. I parted company with him on this particular bill because if I understand the drafting of the bill it would require the State to pay all school funding costs in excess of 8 mils raised locally. I fear it would, as crafted, return us to an expenditure driven model where we've had a fairly difficult time for 20 or 30 years before we introduced EPS 2 years ago. EPS is basically a system by which the State defines a denominator of total cost for education rather than to let the local spending increase and then subsidize whatever it is that has been spent. I think it is time that we defined the amount of money that is truly necessary to do a reasonable and adequate job of educating our children. That is the philosophy behind the EPS system. It is one that I have voted for repeatedly in the last several years. I'm not entirely pleased with the formula, but I would prefer to work out my difficulties and differences within the general policy formulation that lies behind EPS. I would not, at this juncture, repeal it. For that reason I urge that we do accept the majority Ought Not to Pass report and therefore vote favorably on the pending motion. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting.

Senator NUTTING: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. The good Senator from Somerset, Senator Mills, is correct. On most occasions we have agreed on school funding issues. To me, I need to point out also on the record that EPS is an expenditure driven model. The 110 wealthiest school districts in Maine that have got this \$50 million of new money have spent all that money. That is an expenditure driven model, unfortunately. In the process, they have created close to private schools with very low mil rates, small teacher to student ratios, paid elementary coaching staff, and etcetera. These are things that those in the property poor areas in Maine just dream about. I'm amazed that the number one priority seems to be to look at all areas of school funding in Maine except the millions and millions of dollars that are going to the wealthiest districts in Maine. Somehow we can't touch that. That's just something I can't support. I would urge you to vote against the pending motion. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Mitchell.

Senator MITCHELL: Thank you, Madame President and colleagues in the Senate. I, too, like the good Senator from Somerset, Senator Mills, respect greatly the efforts that my friend from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting, continually expresses concerning the allocation of school formula funding. We will be engaged in the most serious debate about that in the next few weeks. I think that was the sense of the Education Committee, to work on some of these issues. I think it's absolutely critical that we all understand one issue in terms of the flow of dollars to communities who did not receive those before. When the referendum was passed requiring the State to fund 55% of the cost of education there was another piece of that referendum which said special education is different. We understand the needs of special education students are really the responsibility of the entire State of Maine and the referendum question demanded that we pay the cost of special education, no matter how wealthy or how poor the district, looking at that as a very special set aside. I want to make sure that everybody understands that, but also to compliment the good Senator for raising continual questions about equity because we all share that concern and will be working collectively in a bi-partisan manner, I hope, in the next week or so as we come together with the final efforts towards administrative savings and the other issues we want to do. Thank vou.

I'm going to ask you to please vote with me in order that we might have a chance to discuss this again in committee. I understand it is a 12 - 1 report. I understand that it is certainly the end of the session, but I would like to speak to my members again. I am going to support the Senator from Hancock, Senator Damon, and vote Ought Not to Pass.
