Prayer by Reverend Kyung-hee Sa, of Wayne United Methodist Church in Winthrop. REVEREND KYUNG-HEE SA: Recently I read an interesting article in the New York Times under the headline of 'Understanding Empathy: Can You Feel My Pain?' It was written by Richard Friedman, the director of the psychopharmacology clinic at the Weill Medical Center of Cornell University. He writes about a married woman in her 20's who had tearfully described her symptoms of depression and asked him, 'How can you understand or help me if you had not personally experienced my pain?' He admits that he is a cheerful guy who had never experienced clinical depression but has successfully treated many severely depressed patients. As a psychiatrist he had met many patients who made requests for a specific type of therapist; African-Americans who wants a Black therapist, Orthodox Jews who insists on having a Jewish psychiatrist, a woman who wants a feminist therapist, a gay man who wants a gay therapist saying. 'I can't take the chance of getting a homophobic shrink', and an elderly woman who had lost her husband to cancer and said to the doctor, 'No offence, but I need someone who is a bit older.' This led me to realize that I had never had a male gynecologist in my life. Friedman found that many patients are looking for understanding of what empathy is all about. He insists that what is critical to understanding someone is not necessarily having his or her experience but it is being able to imagine what it would be like to have it. You don't have to be black to empathize with the toxic effects of racial prejudice or to be a woman to know what it would be like to be denied promotion on the basis of sex. I want to share his pithy powerful conclusion about empathy and how it has a tremendous positive therapeutic force. He writes, 'I remember a patient who once stormed into my office and demanded a white therapist to replace his therapist who was Black. That's a request I turned down, even knowing that this patient's biased beliefs were an appropriate target for treatment. To do otherwise would have vindicated his prejudice and fundamentally compromised the therapy from the start. In the end, empathy is what makes it possible for us to read each other and it is the reason your doctor can understand your problem without actually having to live it.' So the question for us is can you and I feel the pain of others? Let empathy abound. Please join me in a prayer.

Our Creator and our spiritual doctor, every day we face our brokenness in this broken world in the midst of life's tragedies and challenges. We mourn. We feel the pain of the suffering in every corner of the world: the poor in America; those suffering and being killed in Sudan and Iraq; those being starved in North Korea where only one single dollar is sufficient to feed a child with three meals; and those in pain for all kinds of insidious prejudices and discriminations. We ask Your healing power and Your help for us to claim one of our most primal faculties that You have given to us, the ability to understand that things that cause us pain or fear would do the same to others and that we therefore ought not do them. Lead to go extra miles to take responsibility of human suffering in a way to make a difference in our broken world, not with cynicism or mistrust but with empathy and love from You.

Senator GOOLEY: Thank you, Madame President. I wish to speak on this particular LD briefly just to say that the reason that some of us are on the Ought Not to Pass Report conclude that there is a fiscal note attached to this is a General Fund fiscal note of \$72,000 for the biennium. Other than that, I had a couple of other thoughts that I wanted to express. There is a need for better landowner relations. There is no doubt about that because as more land becomes posted in Maine there is a need. The law enforcement wardens are in the law enforcement business and landowner relations is important. The Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Department testified neither for nor against. What they said is that it is no longer realistic to expect the law enforcement bureau in one state agency to handle broad public access issues that treads in different departments' missions and goals. That probably says it in a nutshell. You have to vote your conscience. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bryant.

Senator **BRYANT**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. The committee did work on this bill. The committee did take the position that there is no way that the resources of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is going to solve the landowner relation problems for the State of Maine. We changed the Resolve to include the Department of Conservation, the DEP, Forestry, and all of those people that this person would be working with to get a broader view of the landowner relations problem that we have in the State of Maine. It was the committee's wish that we'd have this vehicle go to Appropriations. If it measured up in Appropriations with all the other problems that are in the State of Maine and if, within their wisdom, they could find opportunities to fund this then they would do so. I would just remind all our members that probably every group in the State of Maine is supporting this Resolve.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Dow.

Senator **DOW**: Thank you, Madame President. I just wanted to correct the fiscal note. The fiscal note for this biennium is approximately \$117,000, for the next biennium it is estimated to be around \$140,000.
