THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen.

Senator ROSEN: Thank you, Madame President and members of the Senate. The proposal that is before us is a report out of the State and Local Government Committee. It is a piece of work that is well intentioned, to try to move along a process to improve the condition of the Cultural Buildings on site here, that are part of the State House complex. This is a response to a request for a report that was issued by the committee last year, or a year and a half ago, to come back in January 2008 with recommendations as to how to move forward with improvements on the buildings here. what's considered the Cultural Complex, the museum, library, and some of the other components that are housed there. The hope was that the report that was delivered to the State and Local Government Committee in mid-January would provide a firm recommendation of replacement of the physical plant or renovation of the existing plant. That would be the end of the report and the Legislature could decide how it wants to go forward from there. Instead the report came back and requested an extension and asked for more funds to study both options, to look at continued review of an entirely new facility, or renovation and replacement, an extension of their work, and a request for more money. Unfortunately, we didn't receive a definitive recommendation. The State and Local Government Committee was willing to accommodate that extension and that request, which is in the proposal that is before you.

They do have a component here that is what I object to and I will be asking you to vote against the pending motion. Rather than recommending that funding for the architectural studies come out of the budgets of these existing agencies and departments, or asking for a directional fund appropriation to pay for the architectural studies, the bill that is before us directs them to go forward and receive grant funding to pay for that study. That's not unprecedented and that has been done before. The part that I object to is that it lists in the amendment that the Director is authorized to apply for grant money for funding including from the New Century Community Program. That is the basis for my objection. I do not believe it is appropriate to give the Director authority to submit an application for funds out of the New Century Program to conduct architectural studies for this State complex.

The reason I object to that is because, if you recall, the New Century initiative, and the different cultural agencies that came together to form that effort, have been extremely successful over the years. In the past many of these separate, small, independent cultural agencies were coming before the Legislature and competing with each other with independent requests for financial support. They came together a few years ago under the New Century umbrella, negotiated an agreement, and would come forward with a unified presentation. That was a very successful way to deal with the Legislature. We even included,

and put out to the voters, a bond proposal for bond funding which the voters approved. The proceeds of those bond funds would be used to distribute to applicants across the state of Maine for primarily small infrastructure projects; your local library, your local historical society building, and other small organizations in the community that otherwise did not have access to funding to help improve some of the historic and cultural gems that exist in their community. I find it inappropriate to now authorize the Director to be able to submit an application and allow that application to be received and considered to compete against these local applicants for New Century funds. If they want to move forward with an architectural analysis for property that is the responsibility of State Government then take it out of the current budgets or ask for a direct General Fund appropriation. I request that you reject this amendment as presented and vote against the pending motion.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider.

Senator SCHNEIDER: Thank you, Madame President. First I want to say this was a bi-partisan, unanimous report out of our committee. There is a good reason for that. The reason is that we were in a Catch-22. As many of you know, cultural activities don't exactly get top priority when it comes to funding. We had a fiscal note on this. Unfortunately, we didn't feel that if we kept the fiscal note, coming out of General Fund appropriations, that this would get top priority and would not make it through the Appropriations Committee process. It's a little bit stunning to me that there should be such an objection by the good Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen, for seeking funds for cultural activities that are very important to this state. We have an obligation to do what we can to serve this state not only for every purpose but also for our cultural activities here at the State campus. That's not happening. We have many needs. We have archive needs. We have museum needs. These are not getting served appropriately because of the tight financial times that we're in. I have a hard time understanding why it's such an objection to say, 'Yes, Director, go ahead and at least try an application,' in a process that happens to be a competitive process which a cultural arts council has to approve. Madame President, I do not see why there is such an objection to this. I would hope that this Body, given the tight financial times, would agree with the unanimous committee report. They heard about this issue in committee, about allowing us to seek funds where we can. It does not take from the General Fund but comes from areas that have a competitive process. I'm really hoping that you will all support this because I think we are all very aware of the tight financial times and know fully that if the committee had left the fiscal note on this it would not have a prayer. Please support the unanimous report, bi-partisan report, of our committee. Thank you very much.
