Senator BROMLEY: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. This bill is going to take a little detour before it gets back to us. I rise to put some remarks on the record so that this Body can share in the good work that brought this bill this far. We often get accused of, and sometimes engage in, making sausage, but I would just want to tell you that this bill is the finest of culinary arts. To that point, this bill is a bill that puts interlock devices on cars of people that have a drunk driving problem. Why I'm rising to speak about this is because the product that first came before the Criminal Justice Committee was not ready for prime time. I so want to thank the good Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond, the good Senator from Aroostook, Senator Sherman, and the Senator from Kennebec. Senator McCormick, in being stalwart supporters of this process to bring this bill this far. With all we have before us, all the disagreements we have, and all the tough work we had, particularly on the Criminal Justice Committee, I simply want to point out that what we did was the people's business at its best. We're increasing public safety. We're also giving a little positive fiscal note to the Highway Table, not that it needs it. We're also making it possible for people that want to mend and heal their lives to do that by being on our roads safely. It's simply to say thank you to my legislative colleagues in and outside of this Chamber as well as a very fine group of stakeholders that worked diligently to bring this product this far. I think it's going to fly through here in another moment, but I just wanted to stop and pause in the action to put my thanks and congratulations to all that helped on the record. Thank you, Madame President.

Senator **SMITH**: Thank you, Madame President. I rise with respect to L.D. 2180 only to clarify, on the record, one small point and to make a further inquiry to anyone who may wish to respond. L.D. 2180 is 'An Act to Ensure the Integrity of Prepaid Calling Accounts'. Since the committee last saw this bill some question has arisen as to whether this bill applies to wireless. It is my understanding that it does not. I would pose a question to anyone else who may wish to clarify this point, as to whether they agree with this interpretation. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Smith poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Bartlett.

Senator **BARTLETT**: Thank you, Madame President. I would concur with the good Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Smith, that our intent was not to cover wireless calling cards. The focus of our committee work was on the traditional landline telephone cards.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brannigan.

Senator **BRANNIGAN**: Thank you, Madame President. May I pose a question through the Chair?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose his question.

Senator **BRANNIGAN**: Thank you, Madame President. Do these cards escheat to the State?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brannigan poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brannigan.

Senator **BRANNIGAN**: Thank you, Madame President. Certain people don't have a clue. I just want to take any opportunity I can to discuss the abandoned property laws of our state, which are being flaunted by corporations across the country. When somebody buys a gift card, and I don't understand any reason why prepaid calling cards aren't the same, they belong to the

people who have paid the money, or the people to whom they have been given as a gift. If those aren't used, that money belongs to the people of the state, where we often try to find the owner. If not, it belongs to the State and not to these huge corporations that are sucking up this money. We're \$17 million down because corporations have not fulfilled their requirements. We have good corporations, of course, like L.L. Bean and others who do escheat to the State. I think calling cards should be included. I'll be talking to the Treasurer about that. He's the one who deals with these issues. I don't see any difference between these and gift cards. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Rosen.

Senator **ROSEN**: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I would encourage all purchasers and recipients of calling cards and gift cards to redouble their efforts to use them and stimulate this economy. Thank you.
