The second part of the question, why is it an emergency measure, is it's because it's a timing question in terms of raising the funds and the report back and whatnot. It's just a timing issue.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Bridgton, Representative Waterhouse.

Representative **WATERHOUSE**: Mr. Speaker, may I pose a question through the Chair?

The SPEAKER: The Representative may pose his question.

Representative **WATERHOUSE**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. Maybe the sponsor of the bill or somebody can point out where I'm wrong. I'm reading on the fiscal note that is on the paperless website, it says the general operating expenses of this task force are projected to be about \$4,410, and it says the legislative proposed budget includes \$10,000 from the fiscal year 2011 to 2012 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2012 to 2013. Is that no longer in operation or is that still part of the budget?

The SPEAKER: The Representative from Bridgton, Representative Waterhouse, has posed a question through the

Chair to anyone who may care to respond. The Chair recognizes the Representative from Newport, Representative Fredette.

Representative FREDETTE: My understanding, Mr. Speaker, when the fiscal note was looked at in regards to this bill, it was decided that the some of the sponsors of the task force would raise all the funds that would be required to do any of the work regarded for this. So I don't know what in regards to what it says in here, but the intent is that this is to be all funded by private monies.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Eagle Lake, Representative Martin.

Representative MARTIN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Just further I will indicate the money is in fact does not come from the Legislative Council. The money will be going to the council and that will be dispersed from that source once the money is raised. The original note, of course, that is being referred to was with the original bill before it was amended by the committee.

The SPEAKER: A roll call has been ordered. The pending question before the House is Final Passage. All those in favor will vote yes, those opposed will vote no.
