THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Hamper.

Senator HAMPER: Thank you, Mr. President. I just wanted to take a minute here to read a couple of quotes from the confirmation hearing about Richard Rosen. "He takes the time to understand the issues across State government, big and small. He has a deep understanding of State government and has the ability to find commonsense solutions." Also another quote is, "He has a thoughtful, deliberate approach to budgeting the State's finances." Mr. President, I really look forward to working with the Senator from Hancock's husband, Richard Rosen, for the upcoming years in Appropriations. We couldn't find a better man to fill the job. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Valentino.

Senator VALENTINO: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I'm pleased to rise today to speak on the nomination of the very Honorable Richard Rosen. Mr. Rosen received the unanimous endorsement of the Appropriations Committee. In addition to all of his legislative and government service that we are familiar with, Mr. Rosen is also well versed in the business world. For more than 35 years he and his wife owned and operated Rosen's, a very successful department store in Bucksport. Most importantly are the character traits that he brings to this position. I have known Richard for 10 years, having served in the Legislature with both him and his wife. I find Mr. Rosen to be a man of integrity. He is thoughtful and is willing to listen to all sides of the issue. His skills will be an asset as the Commissioner of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services. I urge all to accept this nomination. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz.

Senator KATZ: Thank you, Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I rise in support of the nomination today. In the 125<sup>th</sup> Legislature, I had the privilege of sitting next to Senator Rosen in the Appropriations Committee. Like others who joined me there, I got a graduate course in Maine government. All of us benefited from Senator Rosen's institutional knowledge, from his integrity, from his fair-mindedness, and from his perspective. We have seen that following his service in the Legislature with the Office of Policy Management and as Acting Commissioner. It's not lost on many of us that he follows Sawin Millett in that job and the fine tradition of Commissioner Millett. The State of Maine, Mr. President, will be in good hands with Richard Rosen as Commissioner. I think we all thank him for his public service and I hope, and suspect, that the confirmation will be unanimous. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Hill.

Senator HILL: Thank you, Mr. President. In the 125<sup>th</sup> I had the pleasure of sitting next to Senator Katz, who sat next to Senator Rosen, and it was quite a wonderful experience, coming into Appropriations as a total freshman. I have to say to you that I was the Lead at that point for the Senate and Senator Rosen, the good honorable Rosen, was incredibly patient with me, as I had a huge learning curve, for which I appreciate it. He never made me feel inadequate, and that was very important to me, personally.

On a professional level, he was right up there. Always a gentleman. Always a pleasure to work with. You know, I guess the thing that's most important about this position that he's about to step into is that he just has a terrific grasp of budgetary matters. I'm excited he's being appointed and I certainly wish him well. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond.

Senator DIAMOND: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I never sat beside Richard Rosen, but I did, in the 124th Legislature, I was the Senate Chair of Appropriations and Richard was the Senate Lead. I will tell you that between he and Sawin they were two bookends in a very positive way. Very intelligent. You've heard about him being smart. Well, he is. He's very much that. I would also say during that time, that 124<sup>th</sup> Legislature, in the Committee we had five unanimous budgets in two years. Five unanimous in the Committee. He was a big reason for that because he's was the person you could go to. He would come to us. Cooperation. As you've heard, he's a gentleman. He always carried that with him. The trust level was always high. I, for one, can say I'm here today to support this nomination and I know he'll do an excellent job. As you know, the Commissioner of DAFS is the commissioner of all commissioners. They have to answer to him and he has a huge responsibility. I know he'll carry that forward. Thank you, Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate.

My first day in the Legislature, I was brand new, had all kinds of great ideas. I thought I was going to come here and turn the world on fire. Well, after sitting next to Mr. Rosen for about an hour, I realized that that wasn't going to be the case, but he was going to mentor me and all the goings on down in the other Body of how we were to be colleagues, work together, be calm, be quiet, be respectful: all those traits that he has in abundance and I have always found a problem trying to get out of my soul. I had never spoken before in the House and there was an issue that I was very passionate about. Mr. Rosen, you notice I still call him Mr. Rosen, 15 years later, kept on encouraging me to get up and speak. About 2 o'clock in the morning I did. I had no idea the sound of my voice in that Chamber, so when I spoke some people actually fell out of their seats and into the aisle because it was rather loud. After I was done with this passionate speech, I thought it was just going to turn all the votes, Mr. Rosen looked at me and said, "Next time you can try it a little bit lower." Believe me, Mr. President, I'm still trying to get it a little bit lower. I couldn't give my full support behind anybody more than I would behind Mr. Rosen because he's a really great man. We all know that in this Chamber and the other Chamber. We know what kind of patience he has, what kind of dedication he has to the people of Maine, and it's just with my absolute honor to get up and say anything I can to encourage people that this is a real quality gentleman. Thank you very much, and I was a lot lower.
