Dear Senate President Thibodeau:

Enclosed are the reports required under 5 M.R.S.A. §12023, due February 1, 2015. The reports include a list of all procurements in 2014 exceeding \$10,000 for which competitive procurement was waived and a list of contributions made in 2014 that exceed \$1,000.

In 2014, the Maine Turnpike Authority made \$73 million in payments to 700 vendors. The vast majority of these payments, approximately \$63 million, were for competitively bid products or services or were legally or legislatively required. The Authority sole-sourced approximately \$10 million in 2014. Most of these products or services were either proprietary in nature or were procured under long-term contracts. As these long-term contracts expire, the Authority will seek competitive bids.

Section 12023(2c) requires a description of changes to the written policies and procedures required by Section 12022. There were no changes to the policies and procedures required by this section in 2014, therefore, there is nothing to report.

I am pleased to submit on behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Community College System (MCCS) the attached report on certain procurements, contribution and policy changes for the period July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 as required by 5 M.R.S.A. §12023.

On November 28, 2012, the Trustees adopted revised and/or new policies and procedures in the six subject matters required by 5 M.R.S.A. §12022. On February 1, 2013 MCCS reported those policies and procedures to the Legislature as required by 5 M.R.S.A. §12023.

To report the information required by §12023, MCCS developed a customized reporting feature in the business management module of our information systems for each of the seven colleges and the System Office, and then fed that module with data from the purchase order, cash disbursements and credit card systems. There are thousands of purchases and expenditures across the state by the seven colleges, ten centers and System Office every business day. While the task is complex, our review indicates that the colleges' compliance with System policy has been substantial. Expenditures are consistently mission related and, in those few areas where some improvements can be made, they are already underway. MCCS will continue to use its internal controls and annual outside audit to adapt its systems to changing needs, and our Board of Trustees will continue their own ongoing attention to these matters at their regular meetings.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Johnson.

Senator **JOHNSON:** Thank you, Mr. President. I am deeply concerned that this matter actually is before us at this point in light of the fact that this rule, this rule making, has not, since it was first presented to us with the same language and was dealt with by a previous Legislature, has not since then been properly given an opportunity for the public to weigh in with the department and has not followed the Administrative Procedures Act accordingly. This is, I think, something which we should not be, at this time, considering, given that. I have spoken with the Attorney General's Office, the Attorney General, who indicated that, in its present form, the rule making would not be signed off on because of that failing, not having followed the Administrative Procedures Act. Even if the language is the same as the previous time, it needs to follow due process, as a rule, and I would suggest that we not accept this report. Instead we should be moving Indefinite Postponement of this bill and all its accompanying papers.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Saviello.

Senator **SAVIELLO:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I appreciate the concern expressed by the good Senator because I have a policy in my committee, and work hard at it, to make sure that the public is fully informed. I, too, just talked to the Attorney General. Let me say, our interpretation of the conversation is a little bit different. I'm not going to get into that detail. I will tell you that last week, having this concern, I asked that I meet, along with my committee co-chair, Representative Welch, from the other Body, to talk about these rules. I decided not to attend that meeting. Instead I appointed, in a bipartisan fashion, Representative John Martin to take my place. You see, he probably not only knows these laws and rules better than anybody, he probably wrote them. After that meeting he came in and advised me that we can move forward. The other day the other Body passed, based on that advice, the unanimous references in this bill to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources. It's time to move forward. It's time to move them to that committee so that we can do the appropriate work. Thank you very much, Mr. President.
