In Senate Chamber Tuesday February 24, 2015

Senate called to order by President Michael D. Thibodeau of Waldo County.

Prayer by Pastor John Robbins, Hope Haven Gospel Mission in Lewiston.

PASTOR ROBBINS: Good morning and thank you. I appreciate the invitation by the Senate, as well as the invitation through the President and his office. I appreciate the continuance of this practice in most of Maine's history since its founding. My dilemma in the invitation was, number one, trying to aspire those who already are inspired enough to do what you folks do. The other part of the dilemma was brevity, because Baptist preachers aren't known for it. That's just the way it is. I realize that and, from what I understand this morning, that's been demonstrated by some. I'll get to the point. Our State constitutional preamble, in an effort to remain non-sectarian, is quoted to say, in part, "the goodness of the sovereign ruler of the universe and beyond that to enlist His aid and direction." Let me suggest and encourage this Body to emulate the character of our Sovereign and Ruler. God, if I may, as His hand was publically recognized. Let me briefly and humbly present that while His sovereignty is unbroken throughout time, He also continues to allow men free course to choose and to live as they may determine. That's not inconsistent with His purpose. Even with regard to His greatest provision for His creation and that is salvation through our Lord. Jesus Christ, by faith, He doesn't force any individual into that position. It's an individual choice. God, himself, doesn't force anyone to do, but rather, while He's sovereign in the affairs of men, he doesn't micromanage any one particular person or group. Freedom, therefore, is of choice and action and it's left to each individual on their own. I believe this to be the heart and substance of what our founding father, Mr. Jefferson, declared in right to liberty as the unobstructed action according to our will within the limits drawn around us by the equal rights of others. In Section 3 of Article 1, as it applies to religious freedom and of our Constitution in particular, very clearly it's presented the same principle of general freedom. I would urge this portion of the collective Body of Maine government to conscientiously and purposefully determine to examine each issue brought to the floor for its merit, based on our State's Constitution, to see if it falls within its confines, to consider any legislative action and how it impacts the principles of rightful liberty and, finally, if there is any violation of progression beyond the threshold of oversight by our sovereign God. In short, I would ask you, I beg you, not as a clergyman, not as a constituent, but as an individual citizen of Maine, to consider any legislative action in light of the Constitution and the moral boundary and, specifically, within the extend of rightful liberty. I urge you not to legislate, because that's what you're supposed to do, but rather that you would make your goal the representation of the citizenry of Maine within the standards

set in our governing documents and by those standards only. In closing, it's this citizen's view that that is job one of any legislative Body, from the lowest local to the national level, and that we are to aim to protect, maintain, and enhance individual and rightful liberty and not to become overreaching legislative overlords. Would you bow with me for just a minute.

Father, we're grateful today for You bringing this group and bringing them into this place to have leadership over Maine. Father, we ask that You would give them that wisdom and the ability, keeping in mind Your principle of allowing the freedom of man to make choice. We're grateful and we ask You to guide and direct today in His name. Amen.

JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY 11, 2015 AS MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS AWARENESS DAY IN MAINE

WHEREAS, multiple sclerosis affects 400,000 people nationwide, including 8,000 to 10,000 children and teens, and over 3,000 individuals in Maine have the disease, nearly one in 400 citizens, which is one of the highest per capita rates in the nation; and

WHEREAS, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society is a driving force of multiple sclerosis research, pursuing prevention, treatment and cure, and the Greater New England Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society educates, supports and advocates for people with multiple sclerosis and their families to help them maintain the highest possible quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the Greater New England Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society encourages individuals with multiple sclerosis and their families, health professionals and other concerned citizens to join the movement to advocate for policy change in the priority areas of high-quality health care, health care coverage, long-term care and disability rights; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to declare that February 11, 2015 is designated as Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Day in Maine; and be it further

This distinction is usually only for the biggest cities of our country. Secondly, the Portland Ballet also presents their own original work by resident choreographers. Finally, her students. Her students, they have danced on the biggest stages all over this country. Many of you might be asking yourself, "How has Genie done all of this?" First, it's about her leadership, her vision, and her commitment to dance, or, as a fellow creative director said in Portland, "Genie's longevity and success are due to her entrenchment in the community. She knows who to call to get things done and," hear this, "isn't shy about asking them to get involved." Some of you might be stuck at the first amazing stat of 35 years of leading. Here's what another arts director said about Genie, "Just realizing that she has been doing this for 35 years.

with what appears to be an unwavering dedication not only to dance but to the arts in this community, is just astounding. I don't know how people have it in them to do it for so long and with such integrity. It's exhausting work." What has not been mentioned is Genie's vision of giving area high school students, who are passionate in dance, the ability to earn high school credits through the Portland Ballet Corps Program. I could go on and on and, truly, Genie is worth every accolade, but I will end by sharing just how proud I am to recognize Genie for all she has done for dance, for the arts and cultural scene in Portland, for her students and professional troupe, and for the thousands of audience members who are treated to the finest performances in northern New England. Thank you, Mr. President.

WHEREAS, in 1897 the original name of the land-grant school was changed to the University of Maine, and through the years the curricula expanded with the establishment of the School of Education in 1930 and the School of Business Administration in 1958 and the conferring of the first master's degree in 1881 and the first doctorate in 1960; and
