Senator **SAVIELLO:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, it's my pleasure to stand up to recognize two heroes who are with us today, two of my friends from Farmington and they are escorted by their friends and family. Let me tell you a little bit about the story you just heard about. Farmington police officers Darin Gilbert and Mike Lyman were honored at the 17th Annual Maine Association of Police Awards Banquet for an incident that occurred on July 17, 2015 involving a father who reportedly abducted his one year old child and led the police on a high speed chase. On July 16th Somersworth, New Hampshire police issued an Amber Alert for a one year old child allegedly taken from his mother's custody without permission. The mother's vehicle, a gray 1991 Honda Accord, was also reported taken without permission by the child's father, Jeremiah Grant. Farmington Police Officer Darin Gilbert spotted the vehicle matching the description on the Fairbanks Road in Farmington at 1:19 a.m. on July 17, 2015. Gilbert pulled the vehicle over and identified the driver as the suspect Grant. Gilbert was able to confirm the child was still in the vehicle before it took off at a high rate of speed, according to the police report. Officers from the Farmington Police Department, the county sheriff's office, and the Maine State Police pursued Grant as he headed north. The pursuit concluded on Route 17 in New Vineyard where Officer Lyman had deployed road spikes which eventually lead to Grant's vehicle being stopped. As the Chief said, due to the officers' decisive actions the young child in question was united with their mother. This is a story of two men taking leadership roles with a great team from Franklin County that brought a safe ending to an almost tragic situation. Let me speak a little bit about the other gentleman who fits that description, and that is Officer Michael Lyman. Let me share a few of the quotes from his Chief's letter recommending the officer for this award. He specifically cited Lyman taking on added responsibilities of helping to manage the evidence room and for writing, applying for, and administering OUI Grant. He also attended two training programs: Investigating Drug Trafficking and the Field Training Officer Program. One has paid off already as Chief Peck with the investigation of a complex drug case where a person was arrested for trafficking in a drug free zone. In addition to the added responsibilities, Lyman has conducted more than 1,300 motor vehicle stops. As a result 22 drivers were charged with OUI and another 100 were arrested on summons. As Chief Peck said, "Your overall professionalism, dedication, and work ethic to our department helps the Farmington Police meet its mission statement, which is to create a feeling of safety for the people within the Town of Farmington." Finally, Mike, let me just give you some guidance, as Darin is a great example to follow. On occasion Darin has been known to stop me because he thought I might be going too fast. Well, he stopped me and said good morning. He invited me to enjoy the glorious day, watch the speed limit, and make sure that I didn't have any additional paperwork to do that day. For that, Darin, I thank you and, Michael, I hope you will learn from that experience. Thank you very much, Mr. President.
