Expression of Legislative Sentiment recognizing:

People Plus, of Brunswick, on its 40th anniversary. People Plus was established after the voters of Brunswick overwhelmingly voted in 1976 for the town to purchase the former St. Charles Church on Noble Street for a senior center. Involved citizens and town officials started the Brunswick Community Center for Senior Citizens, which served as an activity center and a site to serve meals. Later, the center's board of trustees changed the name to 55 Plus Center to reflect that people 55 years of age and older were welcome at the center. Now known as People Plus, it has become known as a place for social and recreational activities and programs. The center now provides many services to older adults and their friends and families. People Plus provides about 1,100 senior members with health, fitness and education services and serves community shared meals. Thirty-five thousand people came through the doors in 2015, and that number is expected to increase as the population of older adults increases. In 2004 an unused part of the center's building was converted to a safe place for teens to meet, and in June 2010 the center moved to Union Street, where all members of the Brunswick community are welcome. Nearly 250 youths in grades 6 to 12 are served on a year-round basis. Over 3,000 teen visits were recorded last vear while nearly 6,000 snacks and meals were consumed.
