Senator **ALFOND:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I am really glad to stand up here today for my coach, Coach Guiski. Coach Guiski, first of all, was an outstanding teacher. He was an outstanding family man. He was an outstanding athlete and outstanding person that really impacted thousands and thousands of lives in the Dexter area for a very, very long period of time. He had three children. Two of his boys were truly mentors to me as a young athlete growing up in Dexter. The two Guisky boys were icons, playing three sports, winning state titles, and as a young whippersnapper athlete you said, "I want to be like the Guisky's." You want to win and you want to play fair, have fun and wear the Dexter tiger pride. He was a very tough coach. He didn't take any nonsense. He had system. For those of you that play basketball, there are lots of systems but there is a system called the "Flex". It's the most easy system to replicate and try to defend. For over 30 years he ran the Flex. Think about the Flex and think about Hoosiers. It's that simple. If you watch the movie, we had one play. Every team

knew we had one play and marched into their gym, or they'd come into Dexter where I believe the amount of people that could fit in the gym was 972. I still remember that. We would run the Flex and every single team would know we were going to run the Flex and we still would score on them, you know, relatively easily. He was someone that the state has lost a legend, a giant, someone that I could not be a part of. Thank you, the good Senator from York, Senator Collins, for allowing us to add some other names because truly Ed Guisky, Jan, and their entire family has lost someone very, very special. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis.

Senator **DAVIS:** Thank you very much, Mr. President. I'd just like to, if I might, echo what my good friend from Cumberland, Senator Alford, just said. Ed Guisky certainly was a very notable man in the community of Dexter. He came to Dexter after I left, which perhaps tells a little bit about my age compared to Senator Alford's. I have never heard of anyone that had any more respect in the town, no one, than Ed Guisky. Everybody respected him. I remember a friend of mine who played against Ed Guisky in football in high school. This friend came and saw me one time and he wanted to know if I knew where Ed Guisky lived. I said, "Yes, let's go see him." We did and the thing that I got out of that meeting between those two men was the lifelong respect they had for each other. The fair play that they did when they played against each other in football, it was just wonderful, as Senator Alford said. I dealt with him one time. He and his family owned a cottage on Ragged Lake in northern Piscataquis County and the Great Northern Paper Company, the Great Northern Timberlands or whatever it was called, decided they were going to sell the lots and he called me and wanted me to find out information. He wanted to sit down with me. He wanted to go through the whole thing. I was impressed at how he paid so close attention to the details of the whole transaction. He wanted to know everything and he knew what he was getting. I think probably it just reflects back on how he conducted his life. He will be a great loss and I wish the family Godspeed. Thank you, Mr. President.
