schools, and their universities, they dropped their axes, their hammers, their pens, and they joined the military. Because we entered World War I 100 years ago today. Our country declared entry into what President Woodrow Wilson called, "the war to end all wars." We know that that was not the case. In fact, a couple of decades later it was referred to as World War I, after we entered World War II. Our state sent one of highest percentages of our own into battle of any state in the nation. The horrors of that war are well documented. I had a second cousin who was exposed to mustard gas in that conflict, and he made it home but died as a result of his exposure a half a dozen or so -- after the Armistice. I had the great privilege of knowing many of the veterans of that Great War while in my youth. They made a big impression on me as a young man, they are all gone now, but I must say, they are not forgotten. Thank you.
