WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:

Clinton B. "Bill" Townsend, of Canaan, a tireless advocate for Maine's environment for over 50 years. Mr. Townsend began work with the Natural Resources Council of Maine in 1960. A skilled attorney, he helped lead the campaign to create the Allagash Wilderness Waterway and also helped to stop a dam at Big Amberjackmockamus Falls as well as the proposed Basin Mills Dam in the lower Penobscot watershed. He led many negotiations over the years to stop destructive practices and protect places at risk. Mr. Townsend was a member of the council's Board of Directors for nearly 30 years and served as president from 1965 to 1970. He also served the State in numerous posts, including as a member of the Land Use Regulation Commission, the Land for Maine's Future Board, the Whitewater Rafting Advisory Committee and the Task Force on Water Pollution Control. President George H.W. Bush appointed him as one of three American commissioners of the North Atlantic Salmon Conservation Organization. Mr. Townsend will be long remembered for his dedication to environmental issues and will be sadly missed by his loving family and many friends; **HLS 14**
