This is to inform you that, pursuant to Title 3 M.R.S.A., §154, I am withdrawing my nomination of The Honorable Richard A. Nass of Acton for appointment as a member of the Maine Board of Tax Appeals.

This nomination is currently pending before the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation. I am withdrawing my nomination pending enactment of the FY '18-'19 Biennial Budget. As you know, my biennial budget proposal eliminates the Maine Board of Tax Appeals and related administrative structure as of October 1, 2017. Pursuant to this proposal, starting July 1, 2017, all Maine Revenue Services reconsideration decisions may be appealed directly to Superior Court. Because the budget initiative eliminates the Board and provides that the terms of its members expire on October 1, 2017, I feel that it is premature to move forward with this nomination until the biennial budget is enacted.

We heard it yesterday. Anyway, moving on to this. We have rushed through what we saw as some problems and we're already dealing with it in two days, and it's pretty impressive. We have nine months built into this bill to do what needs to be done. We've recognized a couple of problems and they will be on the way to be fixed. We could probably fix them in a week. We could certainly fix them in nine months. We do not need to delay. This, my amendment, seeks only to stick to the original timeline of this bill, that it amends, before the additional three months were added. Nine months is plenty of time. That's the biggest piece that I want to address. Any of the issues that have arisen, people seem to be disagreeing on whether they are a problem or not; but I support the Commission that's being formed to solve those problems, and they also - that has been formed quickly and can deal with the timeline. If we're starting to say that something's a problem before it even gets heard or before we see what problems arise, we're just saying to the citizens who voted for the referendum that they didn't know what they wanted; and that's not true. They knew what they wanted. They knew what they got when they voted it in and they need to have us understand that their will does need to be done. Thank you, Mr. President.
