WHEREAS, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has been committed for more than 70 years to a world free of MS, heightening public knowledge about and insight into the disease; and

WHEREAS, since 1946 the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has been a driving force of MS research, relentlessly pursuing prevention, treatments and a cure, and has invested more than \$900,000,000 in groundbreaking research; and

WHEREAS, funds raised through the National Multiple Sclerosis Society provide \$42,100,000 in funding for 380 research projects at the best medical centers, universities and other institutions throughout the United States and abroad, leading to many breakthroughs in the treatment of MS; and

WHEREAS, stopping MS in its tracks, restoring what has been lost and ending MS forever is the mission of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and one that all Americans and citizens of the State should support; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-eighth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, take this occasion to recognize the importance of finding the cause and cure of MS, to express our appreciation for the dedication that the Greater New England Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has shown toward creating a world free of MS and to declare March 5-11, 2017 as Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week in the State; and be it further

This is a Society that's done very well in terms of allocating a large amount of money, over \$80 or \$90 million per year, to this cause and it's with great pleasure that I put this to express our appreciation for the dedication that the Greater New England Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has shown for creating a world free of Multiple Sclerosis. Thank you, Mr. President.

Senator **BELLOWS**: Thank you, Mr. President. I have a constituent and friend, Marty Henson, who struggles with the challenges of MS, which precipitated an early retirement for her last year as the condition progresses. I'm joining her and her team, the Coast to Coasters, in a Walk MS in Portland on Saturday, April 22nd, at 9 a.m. The first Walk MS event was in 1988 and since then more than \$970 million has been raised for research and programs to try to find a cure and improve the lives of people living with MS. I hope you'll consider joining me and folks from around the state in one of the MS walks this spring or looking us up on our Facebook page and supporting us there.

MS is different for everyone and that makes it even more challenging to solve. It's an unpredictable, often disabling, disease. There are treatments that there were not before, but we really need to do all that we can to find a cure. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Hamper.

Senator HAMPER: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, just a few brief words about the Supplemental Budget. My first discussion on this bill with the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Breen, she brought the fact that there was no money in the Supplemental for opioids, other than there's less than a million dollars in there for the medical examiner's office. That's testing of those who have died. Much to her credit, pat on the back, Senator Breen, we got some money in here. That makes the headlines, the \$3 million, the opioids homes. You know, you look at the news and that makes the headlines. What about the rest of the bill? That's what I wanted to speak about. Thirty-five million dollars into the Stabilization Fund. It takes us from 122 to 157 when, folks, we really need about 600 in the Stabilization Fund. Okay, that helps level things out when the revenue's not coming in. Thirteen and a half million goes to retirement issues with the Community Colleges. Cleans it up. Something that the Appropriations Committee has been dealing with for quite a number of years. A little bit of fiscal responsibility in this thing. Clean it up. We don't have to deal with that retirement issue with Community Colleges ever again. Done. Seven million dollars for the University of Maine System in two parts; \$5 million as far as the President talked about keeping tuitions level, \$5 million helps keep that possible, and another \$2 million which our kids will take advantage of as the Early College Program. There is \$4 million in there for fish hatcheries. Taking care of a couple of issues, Grand Lake Stream and Casco. Taking care of problems at the fish hatcheries and, you know, so that some of us can go out fishing. Lastly, of course, was the opioid health homes. Pilot project. A good start. Let's see how this thing works. A little roundup. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Breen.

Senator BREEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Hamper, for your great leadership on the Supplemental Budget and for articulating to our colleagues here all the other good things that are in that budget. I want to thank Senator Jackson, the Executive Branch, and the Department of Health and Human Services for partnering with me and helping put together something that would address the opioid addiction issue with the Supplemental Budget. I think it was the prudent thing to do and it's not an enormous thing but it's something and, hopefully, as Senator Hamper said, it offers a model, a pilot project, to do something throughout our state that will be effective and that we can reduce those numbers in 2017. Unfortunately, we had a 40% increase in 2016 in deaths from opioid addiction. So I'm optimistic and I think this Supplemental Budget, and the bipartisan support that it has received in committee, sends a great signal for the rest of the session and I want to thank everyone who did such good work on it. Thank you, Mr. President.
