### **JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING SUNSHINE WEEK, MARCH 12-18, 2017**

WHEREAS, James Madison, generally regarded as the father of our federal Constitution, wrote that "a people who mean to be their own Governors, must arm themselves with the power which knowledge gives"; and

WHEREAS, every citizen in our participatory democracy has an inherent right of access to government meetings and public records; and

WHEREAS, an open and accessible government is vital to establishing and maintaining the people's trust and confidence in their government and in the government's ability to effectively serve its citizens; and

WHEREAS, we celebrate open government and recognize its importance in developing how people who believe in democracy think about transparency and its role in government, leading to the adoption of our own Freedom of Access Act; and

WHEREAS, the protection of every person's right of access to public records and government meetings is a high priority for the State of Maine; and

WHEREAS, Sunshine Week was established to spark a discussion about the importance of open government and public access to government documents and meetings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-eighth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize Sunshine Week during the week of March 12-18, 2017 and confirm the basic principles of an open and accessible government in a free society and urge all citizens to join in this observance.

#### READ.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Keim.

Senator KEIM: Thank you, Mr. President. As Chair of Judiciary. one of our responsibilities is the Right to Know, and I just wanted to highlight that Sunshine Week is happening this week. It was a national initiative meant to educate the public about the importance of open and accessible government. It stresses the importance of protecting every person's right to access public records and government meetings. An open, accessible government is important for a number of reasons, but probably most important is to maintain the trust and confidence that people have in their government. The citizens of Maine elected each of us to serve their interests and we must ensure that we are conducting their business in a transparent and easily accessible way. By passing this Joint Resolution we, as members of the 128<sup>th</sup> Legislature, are confirming the basic principles of open government. While Sunshine Week is observed for only one week, I would encourage each of us to reflect on the positive impact that open government has on our state year-round. Thank you.
