THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Langley.

Senator LANGLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Mr. President, for taking this order out of order, actually. Women and men of the Senate, I rise today to recognize the fantastic accomplishments of the students of MDI High School. They are being recognized in both Bodies today for their accomplishments in the field of sports and also on stage. The student athletes of MDI have had guite a year and also the thespians, athletes and thespians, of MDI have had quite a year. Now as Chair of the Ed Committee it's really kind of fun when we have students come down here, and especially from our small school where students and athletes are often in every extracurricular activity that could be had at the school, but last fall the MDI football team made it all the way to the State Championship game but lost to Wells 44-0. My seatmate to the right of me represents Wells. We have this ongoing battle. It was a tough way for the football team to end their season, but, as you know with many of the small schools, these athletes go from one sport right to the next. So those athletes that played football also play basketball and some are also on the track team. After getting manhandled in football, Mount Desert Island turned the tables on Wells in the boys' basketball State Championship with a suffocating defense that paved the way for a dominant 59-39 victory in the Class B State Championship game. Now they could never have predicted that their opponent would be Wells, but it certainly helped motivate the team, just a little bit of revenge when they would face Wells in the Championship game. It was MDI's suffocating defense that proved to be the factor in this success. I can attest to this first hand. As you see, they crushed my hometown team of Ellsworth in our season ending rivalry. I live in Ellsworth and taught in Ellsworth and MDI is our fiercest rival. Now I rooted for Ellsworth in those local games, but as soon as we had lost the whole community in Hancock County was behind MDI as they faced their future opponents. These boys made school history as they won their first State Championship since the high school was formed in the last 60's.

Now in the other Body today not only will the basketball team be recognized but they then have a State Championship indoor track team and the State Championship drama team, all of which came down today. The MDI Trojans won the indoor track title for the first time in school history, and MDI has long been recognized as a powerhouse in the arts and music. It confirmed that with their near perfect scores for the drama team's rendition The Insanity of Mary Gerard. So these are incredible accomplishments for any school, and I don't know if we take enough time to really recognize the accomplishments of our

students and our student athletes, but more so, in my opinion, when the school is such a small school. If you draw a circle around MDI High School most of that circle is in water. They are down on an island. There are kids that come to school that ride a boat, a ferry, every morning to come to school. It's a very unique place. So parents, teachers, administrators, and students should be very proud of these accomplishments and it truly is an honor for me to have them all here today.
