In Senate Chamber Wednesday January 3, 2018

Pursuant to the provisions of Article IV, Part Third, Section 1 of the Constitution and the laws of the State of Maine, the Senate convened in the Senate Chamber at 10:00 o'clock in the morning and was called to order by President MICHAEL D. THIBODEAU of Waldo County.

Prayer by Pastor Aaron Martin, Winterport Baptist Church.

PASTOR MARTIN: Let us pray. Dear Heavenly Father, we just thank You, Lord, for this great State of Maine that we're all privileged to be a part of. We just thank You that You are very powerful, our Creator. We just thank You that You know all about us, you're very personal. From every hair on our head You know. We just thank You that we can't hide from You. Wherever we go You are there, and this all means that, yes again, You are personal. **THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Saviello.

Senator SAVIELLO: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, about seven years ago I met a young man who had just gotten home from an overseas war on terrorism and I had the opportunity to shake his hand and welcome him home and today I get the special opportunity to recognize him for his special service and a special award. But as most of you know, you've read the history of what this gentleman has done, but I want to tell you the rest of the story. Thanks to his Dad I have the rest of the story. To say Ryan was full of energy when he was a boy and into his teens is the understatement of the year. Like trying to herd cats was a good way to put it. Along with his competitive, inquisitive, and 'heck, let's try it anyways' nature, certainly made for challenging moments for his mother and his father when he was growing up. Ryan is now an expert in executing complex waterborne combat operations, but it didn't start out so smoothly. When he was 10, he was told not to take the canoe out on the lake by himself; if the wind kicked up he would go sailing away. So, of course, you know what he did, he took it anyway when his mother and father were out of sight. Some complete strangers spotted him from the shore and rescued him a good mile out in the middle of the lake, heading in the wrong direction. Lesson learned for his future military career and it served as a good opportunity to meet our new neighbors, who we also became good friends with. Ryan was also very competitive, which helped him in through the tough environments

like Sapper and Ranger school and combat tours in Iraq and Afghanistan. His competitive spirit was evident early on. He always knew to cry pretty hard if he lost at the family croquet or volleyball game when he was young. He logged the most penalties whilst playing on the Messalonskee hockey school team, and he drove his sister crazy by turning everything into a competition. If a score was being kept, game on.

The good news is that as time went on he has been able to channel all his energy and enthusiasm into a successful career in the U.S. Army. All his summers on the lake waterskiing, kneeboarding, fishing, sailing, and swimming prepared him well to ultimately become a Sergeant First Class, an Army Ranger and Sapper, and achieve his qualifications in Airborne, Air Assault, plus others. His mother and I couldn't be more proud of the profession he has chosen and the service to his country.

Just to give you an example of some of the awards this young man has been awarded. His decorations include the Meritorious Service Award, the American Commendation Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, the Meritorious Unit Commendation, the Army Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan Service Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism, the Non-Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon, the Senior Leader Course Distinguished Honor Graduate, Army Services Ribbon, Overseas Services Ribbon, and multiple awards of all of these things that I've just described. SFC McCarthy now is a member of the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division in North Carolina. He is a platoon sergeant with the 307<sup>th</sup> Brigade Engineer Battalion, and he lives there with his wife and his 1 year old child. Thank you very much, Mr. President.
