THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Dion.

Senator **DION:** Good morning, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise in opposition to the motion and I would like to request a roll call and speak to that motion.

On motion by Senator **DION** of Cumberland, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Dion.

Senator **DION:** Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen, I rise in opposition to this motion. This has to do with microgrid development and I do so from two points of view. One, in terms of economic development, we often talk about energy costs and that we should do what we can do to lower that. One of the strategies that might be applicable in this instance is the development of microgrids by the private sector. This would allow them to island generation and consumption to specific zones within the State, primarily in business parks or, in a particular instance, this could be helpful to the forest products industry where they could engage in heat and power generation, and one of the problems they had is, under our current rules in the utility law, you can't have a power line cross a highway. This would give them legal authorization to do that. From a public safety perspective, our grid is no longer a state-based platform. In olden days CMP and Emera generated and delivered electricity within State of Maine so it was definitely a local issue for us. Now we are a member of a regional inter-connected grid. It's vulnerable to penetration in terms of cyber issues. It's vulnerable to weather in terms of physical damage. Our capacity to have islands of generation that can disconnect from that grid and continue to provide power to key assets, whether they be public safety, hospitals, key manufacturing sites, is critical to our economy and our collective safety, and that's why I rise in opposition to this particular report negating the possibility of our development of these resources for energy in this state. Thank you very much, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is Acceptance of the Minority Ought Not to Pass Report. A roll call has been ordered. If you are in favor of accepting that report you will be voting yes. If you are opposed you will be voting no. Is the Senate ready for the question?
