Colby is a senior at Sumner Memorial High School. He recently surpassed his 1,000 points in his high school basketball career. I've watched Colby play since his days at Peninsula Grammar School under Coach Kyle Joy.

Colby has always made scoring look effortless, and scoring is what he did, becoming one of only six student athletes in school history to accomplish the feat. He added his name to a short list that includes Tom Lane, Razor Timmons, Jeff Gordon, Leta Leighton, and Jamey Polk. But despite these accomplishments as a prolific scorer, Colby's scoring always came within the flow of the game. He played unselfish basketball and made his teammates around him better.

Colby's Tigers finished the regular season with a strong record after a playoff win at home and made the tournament with 12 wins and seven losses. In Bangor, they would come up against the top seed, Central Aroostook. It would be Colby who would deliver the game-winning shot with one second left on the clock. That moment was the perfect culmination to a remarkable high school career, one that was earned through hard work, dedication, thousands of hours with a ball in his hand, countless rides and road trips by his parents to practices, basketball camps, and AAU tournaments.

I am proud of Colby and his achievements, as I know his parents and the whole Sumner community is as well. Thank you.
