Pursuant to MRSA Title 5, section 12023, the Sunrise County Economic Council (SCEC) is pleased to submit the Quasi-independent State Entity Report to the Legislature on behalf of the Washington County Development Authority (WCDA).

SCEC is a private, nonprofit, federally recognized economic development organization which works to create jobs and wealth in Washington County. We provide staff support for the WCDA and are partnering with the Authority in its effort to redevelop the former U.S. Navy base in Cutler.

As indicated in the enclosed report, the WCDA did not make any significant procurements, contributions or changes to policies and procedures in the past year. In March 2015, the Authority was given the commercial side of the former base by Cutler North, LLC, a private developer that had failed in its redevelopment effort. The WCDA now owns roughly 20 acres and five commercial buildings comprising 75,000 square feet. The Authority is working to bring these facilities back into productive use.

Pursuant to 5 M.R.S.A., Section 12023, please accept this letter of transmittal for the required Quasi-Independent State Entity Review Report from the University of Maine System due 1 February 2019.

The University has an estimated \$1.5 billion annual total statewide economic impact, including direct and indirect payroll, student and visitor spending and, increasingly, purchasing of goods and services from Maine-based businesses which in FY18 totaled \$54.3 million.

While competitive procurement is the University's standard, as provided in State law and corresponding University policy, there are legitimate reasons for waiving competitive procurement in

some circumstances. For example, within the report of FY18 sole source purchasing that follows, a majority of the expenses for which waivers from our competitive procurement process were granted involve the purchase of goods and services that were specifically named in a grant. In an effort to increase transparency and public accountability, new to this year's report is a description of each transaction as well as a review of this report by the UMS Board of Trustees prior to this submission.

Senator **MILLETT:** Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, we are joined this morning by an extraordinary young man, Sam "The Bottle Man" Rideout. Sam is a 4th grader and he's 10 years old. He is in his third year of raising funds and collecting toys for the Barbara Bush Children's Hospital. Sam started as a 2nd grader at 8 years old. Apparently the idea came to him when he saw a Toys for Tots bin at Toys 'R Us and he told his Mom he wanted to use his birthday money to buy toys to put in that bin. His Mom suggested instead to hold a drive of his own. So throughout December bottles could be dropped off at "Sam the Bottle Man" marked donation bins at South Portland Redemption Center and at Falmouth, Casco Bay and North Yarmouth hockey arenas. Sam has actually been spotted in his neon green "Sam the Bottle Man" sweatshirt collecting bottles at the redemption center on Saturdays. Bags of bottles are also delivered to his home and in his aunt's barn in Cape Elizabeth where he has helped in the mornings before school. Eventually Sam set up a bank account, under the name of "Sam the Bottle Man" of course, for people to donate money to the cause. Sam raised roughly \$900 his first year and \$2,000 his second year. That was more than enough for a Brady Buggy wagon which has a trailer hitch to tow a child's IV pole, allowing them to be mobile in the hospital, even during chemotherapy treatments. He raised enough for the wagon and smaller toys like Legos, dolls, arts and craft supplies. This year, this past Christmas, Sam knocked it out of the park. I guess I should have probably had a hockey reference, but he delivered a total of \$6,371 in gifts and donations to the hospital. Sam, I am inspired by your big heart, empathy for others, your determination, work ethic, and leadership. I would be remiss if we did not acknowledge the wonderful support of your family and community as you endeavor to be a bright light for sick children. You have all made our world better and kinder. Thank you, Mr. President.
