THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Deschambault.

Senator DESCHAMBAULT: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, today, and esteemed members of the Senate, I am honored to recognize Judge Michael Cantara who's retiring next week from his current position as a Maine District Court Judge. I've known, I was almost going to call him Michael, Judge Cantara for a number of years and one of the things that's really neat about people is how they got to where they are today and what they've done to become a Judge. Judge Cantara graduated from Biddeford High School and received a B.A. Degree from Colby College in French Literature and French Language as a major and a minor in Biology. I don't know what those two have to do with each other. That's fine. While a student at Colby, he did a year abroad at Universite de Caen in Normandy where he studied French Language and literature for a full academic year and received a Bacalaureat from the Ministry of Education in France. Upon graduation from Colby, he received a Fulbright Teaching Scholarship and, again, returned to Normandy where he taught French in a co-ed vocational high school. After completing Fulbright, he went on to the French Graduate School in

Middlebury, Vermont. He then returned for a full academic year the Universite de Paris and while in Paris, this is interesting, he lived with a French Jewish-Orthdox family where, in exchange for room and board, he taught the family's youngest two daughters English, cleaned their home, took care of the garden, and, because he was expected to make lunch, he learned to keep Kosher. I didn't know that. He then went on for a Doctorate Degree in the French Department at the University of Michigan. That wasn't to his liking and instead went to the University of Maine School of Law. He was in private practice and for 12 years was a District Attorney in York County. Not too many people know this about Judge Cantara but he spent a fair amount of time in politics. He was at the Biddeford Planning Board and was also Mayor of Biddeford in 1988. In early 2007 he was appointed a Maine District Court Judge. Before that he was also the Commissioner of Public Safety. I want to mention something. I was a member of the Maine Criminal Justice Commission and in 2005 Judge Cantera approached us and asked for a grant. He wanted to make televised public service announcements because domestic violence had spiked in the state of Maine at that time, and that was very well received, that you would have a public service announcement on domestic violence. I want to say that exactly what he is, and it's written in our order here. Judge Cantara's career has been marked with a commitment to treating all who came before him with fairness and respect. He has been a champion of justice and safety for victims of domestic violence and their children and a leader in the area of jurisprudence in the state of Maine. I am very honored that we are recognizing him today. He will be retiring. His last day is next Thursday. Thank you very much.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Carpenter.

Senator CARPENTER: Mr. President, thank you. I can't add much to what the Senator from York, Senator Deschambault, said about Judge Cantera. I'll call him Mike because I knew him before he put the black robes on. Primarily, as a District Attorney from York County and then Commissioner of Public Safety under Governor McKernan. I can't say enough good things about Mike Cantera. If you don't know, those of you who don't know him by sight, open up the dictionary. Under 'public servant' you will see a picture of Mike Cantera. He's done about everything that you could do in York County, public service, also for the State of Maine. He will be missed and I'm very sorry to see he's retiring but my guess is we probably haven't seen or heard the last of him.
