JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY 26, 2019 AS SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY WHEREAS, suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States and the 2nd leading cause of death among individuals 10 to 34 years of age; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, one person dies by suicide every 12.3 minutes, resulting in over 44,000 suicides each year; and

WHEREAS, suicide is the only leading cause of death in the United States that has increased every year for the past decade; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that there are over 1.1 million suicide attempts each year; and

WHEREAS, over 90% of the people who die by suicide have a diagnosable and treatable mental health condition, which is often not recognized or treated; and

WHEREAS, suicide results in an estimated \$51 billion in combined medical and work loss costs nationally; and

WHEREAS, the stigma associated with mental health conditions and suicidality works against suicide prevention by discouraging persons at risk for suicide from seeking life-saving help and further traumatizes survivors of suicide loss and survivors of suicide attempts; and

WHEREAS, suicide is a preventable national and state public health problem and suicide prevention must be a priority; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize February 26, 2019 as Suicide Prevention Day and to recognize the importance of the development and implementation of strategies to increase access to mental health and suicide prevention services.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Millett.

Senator MILLETT: Thank you, Mr. President, Mr. President. ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise because today we are marking as Suicide Prevention Day and I don't think we, as a Body or as a community or state, can fully understand the toll that this has taken, especially on our children. We have been having quite a few conversations around suicide prevention in our schools. The amount of distress, stress, in itself; emotional issues, wracking our children as we speak. I just want to share with you testimony that we received several years ago, just a piece of it. 'Late one afternoon this fall I received a call from our Superintendent to inform me that one of our students had passed away. This young girl was a student I had never met and I soon learned that she took her own life. One of my immediate thoughts was: What could have been done differently? As a mother and grandmother, I ached for her family and the siblings who would be returning to our schools. As a member of the community, I witnessed the consuming grief. As a school board member, I thought of our staff and the burden they would have not only to provide support to our students but to understand this loss themselves.' Losing this talented, well-loved student left a gaping wound in the entire district. This happens too frequently in our state and across the country and I ask us all to think about how we can do more around mental health for not just our children but

for their parents and their community members. Thank you, Mr. President.
