Senator H. SANBORN of Cumberland moved the Senate ACCEPT the Majority OUGHT NOT TO PASS Report.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Foley.

Senator FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I rise in opposition to the pending motion. This bill was heard in front of the committee and it's a simple change to the healthcare law that gives pharmacists the title of providing healthcare services. We heard great testimony from pharmacists throughout the state. We had 20 people testify. Only one group testified in opposition to the bill. I know from personal experience with the passing of my father-in-law, God rest his soul, that when he was going through the end of his life his medications got confusing. He got confused. He spent hours with his pharmacist, going over his medications, providing valuable medical services to him, and this change in the law simply recognizes that ability for what the pharmacists do provide for our senior citizens and I think it's a minor gesture to recognize the professional services that they provide. So with that, I oppose the pending motion. I request a roll call.

On motion by same Senator, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator H. Sanborn.

Senator **H. SANBORN**: I just wanted to speak briefly, Mr. President, to my motion. As the Chair of the Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services Committee, I think one of critical roles this session is to ensure that we are using our levers to decrease the amount of money that is spent on health insurance and not inadvertently providing openings for additional monies to be spent on healthcare for Mainers. The concern here is that this may provide an opening for services that are currently included in the price of medications to be billed separately and so that explains why I'll be voting in favor of the Ought Not to Pass Report and just wanted to put that on the record. Thank you.

The Chair noted the absence of the Senator from Cumberland, Senator **DIAMOND**, the Senator from Waldo, Senator **HERBIG**, and the Senator from York, Senator **WOODSOME**, and further excused the same Senators from today's Roll Call votes.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Lawrence.

Senator LAWRENCE: Thank you, Mr. President. It's a pleasure to rise today to honor a constituent and a friend, Robert Nichols. Back when I was a young person and became the District Attorney in York County one of the things I did was substitute in for my Assistant District Attorneys when they were out sick. One day early in my career I substituted in the York District Court, and I was the only prosecutor there, only to arrive and find the parking lot full of truckers and trucking cabs. I had about 30 or 40 trucking cases, as well as other motor vehicle cases, to resolve. For those of you who follow trucking law, and I'm sure there are many of you who do, it is extremely complex and intertwined with the federal and the state law. I said, 'How am I going to get through these 40 cases, make the judge happy, and get them all done by noon?' There a few Troopers there and one of them came forward and said, 'Can I help you with any of these cases?' It was Trooper Nichols and he and I sat down and we took the first case and he explained to me what it meant by the number of axles, the weight, the log of the truck, the road they were driving on, and things like that. He and I resolved that first case and at that point I just handed him a stack of cases and said, 'Here, Rob, you resolve all the trucking cases and I'll take care of all the other cases. Just tell me if you want me to take one to trial.' That's the first time I met him and I came to respect him, his intelligence, his integrity, his ability to deal fairly with people and represent law enforcement at the same time. Quite a career. He's spanned 25 years, and he's not the only person in his family. A couple of years ago we lost his father who was a Trooper for many years. His uncle, Don Nichols, had been a State Trooper. In fact, I think Rob was telling me eight members of his family have served in the Maine State Police. We're sorry to lose him after 25 years of service to the State and eight previous years in service to the Department of Transportation, but it's great to honor, Rob Nichols, for his service to the State today.
