Senator BLACK: Thank you, Mr. President. Good morning, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I am pleased that the members of the Friends of Wilson Lake are able to join us today. Friends of Wilson Lake, or FOWL, were recently named the 2018 Lake Association of the Year by the Maine Lakes Society. FOWL was chosen by the Maine Lakes Society as the Association of the Year because FOWL stood out among many highly successful lakes associations across the state for their recent work they completed to protect Wilson Lake. This includes conducting water sheds for three different water sheds in Wilton, developing a water shed protection plan, running a successful lake smart program, engaging in community lake education activities. obtaining a \$70,000 federal grant to work with the town and landowners to reduce the amount of run-off that was getting into Wilson Lake, FOWL is a leader in lake protection, living up to their mission and inspiring other lake associations across the state to be proactive in protecting our valuable fresh water resources.
