Senator BREEN: Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, it's a hard morning for our Legislative family. I rise just to speak briefly to memorialize my friend and colleague. Dale Denno, who represented the town of Cumberland and part of the town of Gray in the Maine House and passed away earlier this week. Representative Denno grew up on a dairy farm in North Dakota. He was the first in his family to attend college and didn't stop there, went on to law school. Moved to Maine to work for UNUM over 30 years ago in their legal department. From a very lucrative career in the private sector, Dale decided to put his skills and passion to work and went to work in the Department of Health and Human Services, heading up the Office of Family Independence for a number of years. After retiring there he served on the Cumberland School Board and he was a founding member of the community's Aging In Place Community, setting up all sorts of volunteer programs to help his neighbors and

friends in the town he loved so much. He was elected to the 128<sup>th</sup> Legislature, served on the Health and Human Services Committee, and brought great passion to that work. As we know, he made an announcement in the summer but was really committed to running again and serving his community. Unfortunately, he was not able to complete the term but I wanted to send the Senate's sentiments to his family, to the town of Cumberland. Everybody who knew and respected Dale knew him as a big man with a big heart and a big voice and he's left a big void and I thank you, Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, and just ask for a moment of silence.
