I can't, for the life of me, imagine why we would want our special education students to be educated by those who are not certified to handle that population. In addition, at least at the minimum, an explanation and justification should be made prior to approval of an assignment outside of certification. Notification is not enough. Finally, I would add there already is in place a waiver system by which the district may apply to the Department of Education, and within 19 of our school years 75 waivers have already been approved. This bill is unnecessary, Mr. President. Thank you.

Senator **POULIOT**: Thank you, Mr. President. This bill really just allows for more local control. In some districts there's a need to have a teacher go in to a different subject area for a short period of time. This bill only allows for them to do that up to 20% of their time outside of what it is they're credentialed in. So I really don't see this as an affront to any particular special education community or anything like that. It just gives a little bit more autonomy and flexibility to the local district to make that decision without having to go through the process with the Commissioner. So, again, I view this as an effort to help with local control and help provide a little bit of flexibility when there might be a gap in a local district for the Superintendent to make that decision. Thank you.

Senator KEIM: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, L.D. 8 is a pretty simple bill to change a name upon marriage. Currently there's no statutory directive, but it is common practice to be able to change your last name when you marry. This bill, however, would open up that practice so that couples marrying could choose to change any part of their name to anything, not just the typical last names. So they could change their first and last names to anything they choose. I believe in this day and age when we do have considerations of identity theft. I think that the broadness of this bill doesn't serve the public well. I think if a couple is going to change their name to something really outside of the general and normal scope, I would say the traditional scope, that they should still go through a Probate Judge and that Judge could do a criminal background check if they felt that was necessary and would also be able to give public notice. So I think the idea is a good one and I think the broadness of it, however, is not in the best interest of the public. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Carpenter.

Senator CARPENTER: Thank you, Mr. President. As the Senate will note, when they look at the report, it was a pretty broad based unanimous bi-partisan report, the Majority Ought to Pass Report. It does what Senator Keim says it does. It now, for the first time, puts into Maine law the legal authority to change your name upon marriage. She mentioned identity theft. Identity theft is a concern. With Real I.D. we need to have a statute in place that gives authority upon marriage to change your name. Otherwise you have pay a fee and go to the Probate Court and go through that process where, again, the Judge is left with very little discretion. I'm not aware if a Judge has the authority to turn down a name change. I've seen some pretty strange name changes come through the Probate Court system. So, there is a system there but why make people go through that when they can do this, if they wish or if they don't, when they get married. It's simply a form on the marriage license. Becomes effective when it's filed. I ask you to follow my light.

I think the problem will be that small towns, in particular, are going to be faced with unexpected obligations and, although I agree with what Senator Chipman from Cumberland has said, and he makes a good point, my concern is the unintended consequence of putting small towns in jeopardy only because they can't plan for it. This includes first time homebuyers, the first time they buy a home even though they may have already bought five before that. This really includes the home buy and not having to wait a year, as has been explained. So I just put that out before you and explain why I cannot support the motion. Thank you, Mr. President.
