SENATOR DESCHAMBAULT: Bonjour. Alright, good. You know I always have a little story. This one's short. It's not five minutes long. The origin of the Peace Prayer of St. Francis. I graduated from St. Francis College. It is now University of New England. I learned something here. The first appearance of the Peace Prayer occurred in France in 1912. The prayer was titled Belle priere a faire pendant la messe, a Beautiful Prayer to Say During Mass, and it was published anonymously. The prayer was sent in French to Pope Benedict XV in 1915. Around 1920 the prayer was printed by a French Franciscan priest on the back of a picture, anyone who went to Catholic school knows des image de saint, a picture of Saint. So he printed that prayer behind St. Francis of Assisi and that has been attributed, that prayer, to that Saint. Between the two World Wars the prayer circulated in Europe and was translated into English. The first translation in English that we know of appeared in 1936 and it clearly attributed the text to St. Francis of Assisi. During WWII, and immediately after, this prayer of peace began circulating widely as the Prayer of St. Francis. Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.	Ordered sent down forthwith for concurrence. On motion by Senator **MOORE** of Washington, Senate Amendment "A" (S-100) to Committee Amendment "A" (S-78) **READ**.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Moore.

Senator MOORE: Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment that I present to you provides funding for school administration units who start or expand a Breakfast After the Bell program for fiscal years 2019 and 2020 and removes that indication of ongoing funding that was included in the original amendment. This amendment also specifies that the funds provided do not lapse but are carried forward. Maine has a significantly higher number of households struggling with food insecurity and hunger than the national average. Roughly 192,000 Mainers struggle with hunger. One in five Maine children live in a food insecure home. RSU 39 in Caribou reports 75% of morning visits to the nurse are because of hunger. Nearly half of Maine children qualify for free or reduced priced meals, including breakfast, but only 42% of the students who participate in free or reduced priced lunch programs also participate in school breakfast. The reason: they have to rely on adults, school bus schedules, and carpools to get them to school on time. Once at school, students have to worry about whether they have enough time to go to the cafeteria, get a tray, eat breakfast, and get to their first class on time. There's also a great deal of social pressure and stigma that comes from being singled out as a child that needs school breakfast. What can we do? Make sure breakfast is served at a time when most students are already at school, making it available after the bell to ensure the students who need breakfast have access to breakfast to start their day. I'm a breakfast person myself. As a Weight Watcher's coach, one of the first things I taught my members was that breakfast is the most important meal of the day. When I was the Mayor of Calais I saw the power of a school breakfast program at work and how much more willing children are to sit still and learn when they're starting the day with a full stomach. Now, as the Senator for Washington County, one of the most rural and poorest counties in Maine, I'm all too aware of how having breakfast at the schools means better concentration, alertness. memory, and comprehension. One Maine food service director who implemented Breakfast After the Bell in her school said the teachers, while initially resistant to food in the classroom, quickly came around when they saw how much more focused the children were, how they were calmer, and they were ready to learn. This Breakfast After the Bell bill would give each school the choice to implement the program that's right for them; whether it be a grab-and-go cart, a second chance breakfast, or breakfast in the classroom. We know this is good for students. It's also good for Maine's bottom line. The federal government reimburses our schools for each breakfast they serve to students who are eligible for free or reduced priced meals. This means the more meals served the more federal dollars come to our schools and state. If implemented in all 271 schools, this bill could bring

in an estimated \$13,610,197 annually into the budgets of local schools. We make sure our children have the desks, books, and supplies they need for their education. What about food? It shouldn't be optional. I ask you to follow my light. Thank you, Mr. President.
