**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Breen.

Senator **BREEN**: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, men and women of the Senate, it gives me great pleasure today to recognize the hard work and retirement of a friend in this building and a constituent in my Senate district, Greg Sweetser, who is retiring as the Executive Director of Ski Maine, an industry group that works to promote skiing and all sorts of outdoor recreation in Maine. As you might know, the economic impact of the skiing industry in Maine is over \$300 million. This doesn't include indirect values such as home purchases or property tax paid by seasonal residents who ski. Mainers and visitors make 1.3 million

ski visits per year. The Ski Maine Association coordinates with the Office of Tourism and advocates for the state's winter sports industries through governmental affairs and public relations. It works to foster cooperation between the major ski areas and the small ones alike. It was the leader in establishing the 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Passport Program which let many young Mainers ski for the very first time because their families were not skiers and they did not have the means. The Passport Program grew into WinterKids, which Greg Sweetser helped found. WinterKids' mission is to create opportunities for children to be active, vibrant, and healthy in the outdoors. School kids from all over Maine are eligible to participate in WinterKids. They also distribute safety information for skiing and snowboarding for all Maine kids and families who participate in ski recreational programs. As the parent of a young man who makes his living at a ski area right here in Maine, I am here to tell you it's great work, especially if you like to work overnight making snow. Somebody's got to do it and my son loves it. So, I thank Greg for all he's done. On a personal note, he has not worked just for the ski industry. He has certainly worked in partnership with many other recreational boosters, trying to boost the rural economy in Maine, expand the economic capacity of the state's rural mountain communities. Not just downhill skiing, he also includes such activities as snowboarding, snowshoeing, and Nordic skate skiing. Greg is retiring after 24 years to help run his family's business, Sweetser's Apple Barrel and Orchards. Many of you may have visited. It's a fifth generation family farm in Cumberland Center that has 1,000 apple trees, including 53 apple varieties. So when he's not busy contributing to the ski economy he's busy contributing to our agricultural economy. So I want to thank Greg on behalf of the Senate and for my district and I thank you, Mr. President.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Waldo, Senator Herbig.

Senator HERBIG: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, women and men of the Senate. I feel really privileged today to get to recognize National Girls and Women in Sports Day. This was on February 5<sup>th</sup> but because of the weather we've been having I'm joined by some really special guests here in the Chamber today to take a moment to acknowledge the importance of sports in women's and girl's lives. So a lot of you may not realize this but, actually, in the late '90s Senator Luchini and myself were the top two long distance runners in the state of Maine. Senator Luchini was the best male runner in the state of Maine and I was the best female runner. What's really funny about this is that somebody just recently handed me a newspaper article that they had done about Senator Luchini and I in the late '90s because we were recruits, which was a big deal in rural Maine at that time. Both Senator Luchini and I pretty much had our choice of colleges we could go to because of our achievement in distance running. Now we're here today, so look at us. What's really interesting about that, having that choice was a pretty big deal, which being able to go to any college you want for free is an incredible opportunity, one that probably Senator Luchini could have counted on most of his life but for me, I was a Title 9 girl. Title 9 was such an incredible thing to happen in this country that gave women the same opportunities as men, to be able to have the same opportunities in academics. I was able to attend a college that I never would have been able to afford otherwise and, in turn, I was able to be the very first person in my family to go to college. Title 9 made such an impact in the trajectory of life. It is the basis for why I probably ran for office and why I am in this Chamber today. I was able to go to BC on a scholarship. I was able to travel this country and world. I was able to see myself in environments that I never would have thought possible otherwise. Aside from the fact that athletics teaches you wonderful things about leadership, discipline. I mean it's not a coincidence that there are a bunch of distance runners in these two Chambers. Sports teaches you incredible skills about yourself. It allows you to set goals and realize your full potential. You know, I will also say that it wasn't just my life it changed. I think about the day that I graduated from Boston College, first person in my family to go to college. I come from a family of poultry farmers in Waldo County. My grandparents, it was the first day they had gone to Boston was to see me graduate from BC in that big football stadium. You know, it makes me think that in this Chamber we do a lot of things, passing laws and creating more opportunities for more people in the state and in this country, and I tell you this story because I want you to realize that some of the things that we do create incredible opportunities and change people's lives. This is just my story but I think about the hundreds of thousands of women that have been impacted by this, not just to be able to achieve incredible things in athletics but also in academics and how the bar that they have set for themselves has been raised because of an important thing like Title 9 and because of days like this. So thank you for listening to my story. Thank you to the incredible women that are here joining me today. This is an important part of our history that continues to put more women in leadership roles and in places like this Chamber. So thank you.
