Senator VITELLI: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, I'd just like to say a few words on behalf of this nominee for Public Advocate position, William Harwood. As a member of the EUT Committee, I had a chance to listen to his conversation with us and had a chance to talk to him beforehand as well and, knowing the role of the Public Advocate, I looked for three things that were going to be key in getting my support. THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Stewart.

Senator STEWART: Thank you very much, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise today in opposition to this nomination, this particular nomination. You will see that this vote of the Health Coverage, Insurance, and Financial Services Committee was divided, basically, on party lines. So, I wanted to rise to just provide a little bit of context there. This is a confirmation for the Advisory Committee to the Council on Affordable Health Care and this is an entity that is new, it has not met yet. We're confirming a number of these appointees today and there was one particular issue that stood out to us, as Minority Republicans on the committee. The charge of this group is to be finding new and creative ways to lower health coverage costs in the state of Maine and this particular nominee has a long history that stems back a couple of decades to a previous program that was called Dirigo Health. Dirigo Health is something that we categorize as a colossal failure of health insurance in the state of Maine and something that we do not feel is appropriate to have an individual there that is, effectively, going to be rolling back the clock two decades to that program in terms of new ideas. We think there's other folks that could be better situated to serve in that capacity and so we oppose the nomination of this particular nominee for that reason. So, I would encourage my colleagues to follow my light in that regard and we'll find others that could be better suited for this role in the next round of nominees, which I believe is coming something later this week. Thank you, Mr. President.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Sanborn.

Senator SANBORN: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, I rise today somewhat discouraged by the comments from my good friend from Aroostook. Trish Riley, who I've known for many years now, is - has been chosen by the Speaker of the House to serve on an Advisory Council for the Office of Affordable Health Care as a 'member with expertise in health economics and research' and, as I think about the people that I know in Maine and that I've worked with over my last six years of legislative service and prior to that in public policy, Trish Riley is the epitome of a person in Maine who has expertise in health economics and research. She has served five Governors of the State of Maine and in between her public service she founded an organization called the National Academy of State Health Policy, which is a non-partisan non-profit housed in Portland and in Washington D.C. It has been in operation since 1987 when Trish founded it and it is on the leading edge, not going back 20 years to Dirigo Health policy, whether we think that was a positive or a negative. Trish Riley and her organization have been on the leading edge of efforts to curb hospital costs, to get a handle on prescription drug prices, to pull every lever we have as state policy makers to make sure that healthcare is affordable and accessible for people who live in our state. She's done it on a non-partisan basis and she's built an organization that is known across the country for being a leader on cost, access, and affordability issues within healthcare policy and, particularly, with prescription drug policy. The idea that Trish Riley can't lead us forward and help be an advisor on leading us forward because she served in the Baldacci Administration when Dirigo was experimenting with a certain set of attempts to make healthcare more accessible and affordable before the federal government had taken the actions that it did in 2010. The idea that she doesn't bring that experience and that wealth of expertise to the table in that advisory committee, all the things positive and negative that she has learned from over those years is not really giving her the credit that she is due for her decades and decades of experience and expertise in health economics and research. So, I also would be remiss if I didn't say that I think this advisory board needs true public servants on it. Trish Riley recently retired from NASHP and when I saw that she had accepted the Speaker's offer of appointment for this advisory council I was so encouraged because she just retired and yet she's stepping forward to serve on this advisory council to establish this new Office of Affordable Healthcare. Most of the other members, and I mean no aspersion to them, but most of the other members of this advisory council are registered lobbyists, Mr. President. They represent the interests of the organizations that they are employed by and they will be paid for every meeting they show up to by their employer as part of their salary. Trish Riley accepted this appointment as a retired individual with exactly the expertise and independence and additional world view that we need on that advisory council. Mr. President, I urge the members of this Body to vote red and accept the recommendation of the Health Coverage, Insurance, and Financial Services Committee with regard to the nomination of Trish Riley as a member of the Advisory Council for the Office of Affordable Health Care. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Daughtry.

Senator DAUGHTRY: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise in strong support of my constituent and friend, Trish Riley of Brunswick. I've known Trish most of my life. Just going to put that right out there. She has been an incredible friend and an incredible mentor. When I think of Trish I think of someone who is kind, diligent, witty, selfless, devoted, and, honestly frankly, smart as a whip and constantly blows my socks off every single day any time I talk to her about anything to do with healthcare. As you heard from the good Senator from Cumberland, she is a prominent leader on affordable and accessible healthcare. Before I focus again on some of the things just about her, I want all of us to think about what we bring into this Chamber, what our decision making process is, and no matter what's in front of us, whether it's confirmation or a bill or whether it's a constituents meeting with us with an ask, we try to evaluate everything from all angles and I think one of the most valuable lessons that we need to hold dear, no matter who we are, no matter where we're from, and no matter the letter next to our name, is that we have to be able to learn from history and if we're not, you know, informed by what has come before us then we are doomed to repeat mistakes and failures over and over again. Without learning from the past, we'll never be able to truly innovate or, frankly, come out stronger from any situation than what we walked in to. Literally, her experience that the good Senator from Aroostook County was so focused on is what makes her so valuable to this position. Having seen what didn't necessarily work before in our state is what will inform her ability to be able to find what works here. Being able to know what might have been a success or a failure under prior Administrations will make her absolutely and utterly invaluable. She also has a track record of working with everyone. As the good Senator from Cumberland said, you know, she's worked under five different Governors. I'm concerned that going against this nomination because of what Administrations she served under dooms many incredible public servants who work under various different Administrations to a really unfortunate fate. So, I urge my colleagues to please, please follow my light, vote red for Trish Riley. You can look up her resume. She has a wealth of experience and we'd be absolutely foolish and shooting ourselves in the foot not to put someone with her mind and absolutely one of the kindest people I know into this position. Thank you so much

It was no fun being in the trenches at the time because the rules were changing but I was reassured by the efforts of that effort to bring people together from lots of different perspectives and that's what I respect and I have seen continued leadership from Trish Riley for many, many years in various capacities and I will be delighted to press the red button shortly. THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Breen.

Senator **BREEN**: Thank you, Mr. President and thank you for taking this item out of order. We have President Cummings here, along with other distinguished members of the University community, so we wanted to make sure we were able to do this while everybody was here. It gives me great pleasure and I find I must say bittersweet pleasure because I think all of us in Southern Maine really recognize the tremendous accomplishments of Glenn Cummings during his tenure as President of the University of Southern Maine. It just so happens that one of my children lives in the neighborhood of USM so I'm over there quite frequently and it's been a real treat over the last couple of years to see the renovations and the improvements and the capitol expansion going on at USM. I think that under Glenn's leadership we can really see the growth and flourishing of a thriving metropolitan campus and it's been very, very exciting to see that sort of metropolitan campus growing and taking its place in the broader UMaine System. So, I was sad to hear when President Cummings decided to step down but, you know, change happens. I understand he's going to be staying on the faculty at USM as well as doing some philanthropic work in the community so I'm sure we will continue, as a community, to benefit from his skills and commitment. But, obviously, many of you know him from his work here in the State House and his extraordinary leadership in the Education Committee and in some of the founding legislation and funding for the Community College System here in Maine. So, I wanted to make sure that this Body had the opportunity to recognize Mr. Cummings and thank him for his extraordinary service in the University of Southern Maine and to the University of Maine System in general. Thank you, Mr. President.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Chipman.

Senator CHIPMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate. I first came to meet Mr. Cummings back in 2002. when I was actually working as a Legislative Aide here in the State House and he was serving in the Maine House. He served as Majority Leader and went on to be a great Speaker for us. Fast forward several years later, in 2011, when I was elected to the Maine House myself to serve and was contacted by several workers, students, and members of faculty who were constituents of the district I represented who were very frustrated at the time with things that were going on at the University of Southern Maine. There were cuts made to programs. I believe two entire departments were being eliminated. Several hundred faculty were being eliminated as well. Folks were very frustrated. I found myself down there working with students and faculty and workers protesting these cuts, showing up to board meetings at the University, and introducing some legislation to try to stop some of these things from happening and standing up for them and representing their interests and things were quite in disarray. In order to have a successful university you have to have good relations with the workers, with the faculty, and with the students and that was not the case at that time. Soon after that Glenn Cummings was brought on to be the President of USM and was able to accomplish something that two of his predecessors were not and that was that he was able to earn the trust and confidence of the workers, the faculty, and the students of the University and, coming in like he did and really turning things around in a significant way, I heard nothing but praise from constituents who had contacted me before with all of these problems saying Glenn had done such a great, amazing job at the University and was so impressed with him and he was just amazing. I think it's a real loss for us to lose him at USM but I wish the best of luck in his retirement and we need more people in the state like Glenn Cummings. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond.

Senator DIAMOND: Thank you, Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I first met Glenn Cummings when he was a Representative. He represented the city of Portland. It's not his fault. One of the things I learned about him right off is he had a great sense of humor and that is an asset that many of us should have and he certainly did. He was Chair of the Education Committee, as you've heard. That was before that committee became so prestigious. But he worked so well in that committee. He was Majority Leader and at the time he had Hannah Pingree as - no he didn't, he had Bob Duplessis as his Assistant. Bob did most of the work, as we knew. Then he was Speaker of the House but, then again, he had Hannah Pingree as Majority Leader and he had Josh Tardy on the Republican side, so he really didn't have to do too much there, so that worked out well. Seriously though, I've always admired Glenn because of his competence and his abilities. He came to USM at a time when it was in a lot of turmoil. It had gone from Gorham State Teacher's College to Gorham State College to Po-Go University, that was a nice name, and then it went to USM. But at the time that Glenn came in, that was a time, as I said, of turmoil, unrest, and he was able to bring that all together, to a point where when you talked to any faculty member now and they'll praise him endlessly. That's not always the case when you have Administrators at the college level, the university level. That is the case now. The business community, of course, speaks highly of him on a regular basis. They know what good he's done for the city of Portland and for Gorham as well. He had one idea, though, that he wanted to change the name of USM to University of Maine Portland. That didn't go so well. We still had USM but he was really good. He called me up and said he thought he might change his mind or delay that for a while and it worked out really well. I think that, again, he really did - he provided a tremendous service to our state and to our University System and mostly to the students because the students - to the students the University of Southern Maine became a home to everybody and I think that was a critical part of that. That's the feeling we want all students to have. No matter who or where they came from, that's an attribute which I think rests solely with the skills of President Glenn Cummings. So, I'm sorry he's leaving. I think we're going to miss him. I know we will. But I'm glad he's here today so he can hear and accept all of the congratulations from us. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis.

Senator DAVIS: Thank you, Mr. President. I share the comments of my colleagues, Senator Diamond and Senator Breen. It is a bittersweet moment. I'm happy for Glenn, very happy for him. I know that he will be a loss for all of us. Twenty years ago, when I was - don't you just hate those things - twenty years ago I was the Leader here in the Senate and Glenn Cummings was a Leader in the House and, believe it or not, I finally found a Democrat that I could agree with on things. I didn't know that would ever happen but it did with him. We worked together on getting lead paint out of older homes and it was a struggle but we did some good things and we got a lot of it out. I know they're still working on it. We also both advocated for vocational schools. There wasn't really anybody speaking up for them at that time but, Mr. President, as you well know how important they are, Glenn and I did and we managed to improve things greatly within the state's vocational schools. So, again, it's

a bittersweet time. I'm very pleased for him and God's speed, Glenn. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair would just like to add that I, too, want to thank Glenn for all his work. Glenn's someone that actually has been to my district. I've seen him ride on the snow sleds and at Can-Am and, you know, certainly took a different approach in making sure that he understood parts of Maine that sometimes other people wouldn't and, you know, giving me an opportunity back when I served in the House with him. He was a really great friend. Somebody you could joke with and we definitely had a lot of good, good laughs in the House and I just want to thank him for the way he approached things, the way he dealt with us, and certainly the opportunity he gave to me. So, I'm sorry to see him step down but I know you're going to be around and look forward to working with you more in the future. Really appreciate it.
