WHEREAS, eating disorders are serious but treatable mental and physical illnesses that can affect people of all genders, ages, races, religions, ethnicities, sexual orientations, body shapes and weights; and

WHEREAS, while no one knows for sure what causes eating disorders, a growing consensus suggests that it is a range of biological, psychological and sociocultural factors; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, 9% of people will experience an eating disorder at some point in their lives; and

WHEREAS, eating disorders have the 2nd highest mortality rate of all mental health disorders; and

WHEREAS, the National Eating Disorders Association helpline has experienced a 107% increase in contacts since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Eating Disorders Awareness Week is a collective effort of individuals from every walk of life, including persons with lived experience, family members and friends; students, educators and coaches; and professionals, health

care providers and organizations committed to raising awareness of eating disorders; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Thirty-first Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize February 27 to March 5, 2023 as Eating Disorders Awareness Week and encourage the citizens of Maine to support the annual awareness campaign to educate the public about the realities of eating disorders and to provide hope, support and visibility to individuals and families affected by eating disorders.

We think Needhams were first created by Seavey's Confections in the 1870s and since then, Mainers have fully embraced the Needham, making the treat in

kitchens and storefronts across the State. Seavey's remained open in Auburn until they sold their company to Lou-Rod Candy of Lewiston in the early-1960s. Today, Needhams are a part of many Mainers' family traditions. My own family sends Needhams to family that lives out of state and I know I would be in big trouble with my Aunt Cher if we didn't send those to Texas every year. So, just in closing, don't take it from me, one business owner, Sue's Needhams, said this; I've been in business going on 33 years. I started my business so that people could enjoy a local Maine Needham made the traditional way with only Maine potatoes and be able to buy them at local stores. Through the years, Sue has seen Blueberry Pie Day, Whoopie Pie Day, and Needhams seem to be overlooked. We all know that Needhams are a traditional Maine candy and Sue says it would be nice to give Needhams the recognition they deserve in the State of Maine where they originated and are loved by many. Thank you.
