Rule 312. Fiscal Notes.

Every bill or resolve that affects state revenues. appropriations or allocations or that requires a local unit of government to expand or modify that unit's activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues and that has a committee recommendation other than "Leave to Withdraw," "Ought Not to Pass" or "Referral to Another Committee" must include a fiscal note prepared by the Office of Fiscal and Program Review. For a bill or resolve not yet reported out and upon request of a majority of the committee, the Office of Fiscal and Program Review shall, after notice by the committee to the sponsor of the bill or resolve, meet with the committee at a work session to present its analysis and provide copies of the written public materials relied upon by the office to prepare that fiscal note. The fiscal note must be complete, available to the public and attached to any bill before the committee votes on it and the bill is reported out of committee. The fiscal note must accompany the committee report before it is reported out of committee. Any amendment introduced that would affect the fiscal impact of the original bill must also include a fiscal note. The Office of Fiscal and Program Review has the sole responsibility for preparing all fiscal notes.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Daughtry.

Senator DAUGHTRY: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, it is my great honor and pleasure to recognize Lois Skillings of Brunswick and welcome her to the Senate Chamber today. After serving as President of the Mid-Coast Parkview Health, Lois will be fully retiring by the end of this month. Although Lois has served as the President of Mid-Coast Parkview for the past 11 years, her 43 year career there started much sooner. This was before I was even born, which means that I've literally never gotten care in my community when Lois wasn't there and I was born at Parkview, too. In 1979, Lois started as a nurse, tending to patients bedside. Nursing is a hard but rewarding job. You check in on patients who are afraid, scared, upset. You learn their names. You meet their families or friends. You try to comfort them, all while monitoring instruments, checking rounds, running up and down the hallways, and balancing many different tasks. Some patients recover, others don't. But all the time nurses bear witness to the entire human condition, including its miraculous ability to heal and survive but also its heartbreaking ability to succumb. Having family members who are nurses, I know just how hard this position can be and toll that it can take, but how absolutely lifechanging and what it takes to be successful in this position. Lois embodies every single one of those traits. Lois became the Vice-President of Nursing and, during her career, whatever role she had, Lois witnessed many, many changes to how diseases and illnesses are diagnosed and treated. The medical field changes rapidly from year to year and sometimes even quicker than that. No matter the changes, Lois firmly was committed to one mission; providing outstanding, compassionate care and services to patients throughout the midcoast. In 2015, Lois oversaw the merger with Parkview Adventist Medical Center and in 2020, just five years later, Lois oversaw another merger, this time with Maine Health, being the largest healthcare provider and employer. Now, if that wasn't enough, we all know what happened in March 2020 when COVID-19 completely turned all of our lives inside out and upside down. But none of us were as affected more severely than the frontline healthcare workers at Mid-Coast Parkview Health and all healthcare centers and hospitals across Maine. Many of our family, friends, and neighbors would not be here today if it weren't for the dedicated doctors, nurses, physicians' assistants, and countless others in the medical fields who tended to COVID patients, whether as administering COVID vaccines and boosters, trying to save someone's life on a ventilator, or trying to give someone just a glimmer of hope that everything would be okay. No matter the challenge in front of her, Lois has faced everything with empathy and grace. In that moment of strife, she was exactly the calm in the storm we needed. She helps us feel calm and steady, even in the worst of times.
