SENATE.

Augusta, Jan. 21.

Senate met according to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Ward of Augusta.

Journal read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Plummer of Penobscot, bill, an act to incorporate the Pistol Stream Dam Company, the vote to concur in its reference to the committee on interior waters was reconsidered, and on further motion of that senator the bill was tabled to be printed, pending its reference.

Bills, petitions, etc., presented and referred:

EDUCATION.

By Mr. Weeks of Somerset—Resolve in favor of Somerset Academy at Athens.

ANDROSCOGGIN COUNTY DELEGATION.

By Mr. White of Androscoggin—Bill, an act in relation to the probate court in Androscoggin county.

ORDERS.

By Mr. Plummer of Penobscot,
Ordered, that the Penobscot county delegation be instructed to inquire into the expediency of fixing stated salaries for the several officers of said county now paid by fees, and report their conclusion to the Legislature by bill or otherwise.

By Mr. Titcomb of York,

Ordered, that the secretary of the Senate be directed to furnish the assistant messenger, doorkeeper, folder and assistant folder of the Senate, stamps and wrappers not to exceed in amount \$10 each for the purpose of distributing the reports of the various departments.

READ AND ASSIGNED.

Resolve for the purpose of operating the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish, and for the proper enforcement of the inland fish and game laws.

PASSED TO BE ENGROSSED.

Bill, an act relating to Franklin Real Estate Company.

FINALLY PASSED.

Bill, an act to regulate ice fishing in Thompson pond in Oxford, Casco, Poland and Otisfield.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

On motion by Mr. Staples of Knox, Senate bill No. 3, being report of the committee of the Executive Council in charge of construction, and itemized account of sums of money expended in the construction of the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital, having been tabled for printing, was taken from the table and referred to the committee on financial affairs.

On motion by Mr. Titcomb of York, the Senate adjourned.
