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

SENATE.

Augusta, Jan. 22, 1901.

Senate met according to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Beale of Augusta.

Journal read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

READ AND ASSIGNED.

Bill, An act to amend the charter of the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company.

Bill, An act to revise the organization of the parsonage fund of Bucksport.

On motion by Mr. White of Androscoggin—Bill, An act to amend the charter of the Rockland, Thomaston and Camden Street Railroad, which came from the House, on which the Committee on Railroads, Telegraphs and Expresses had reported that same ought to pass, was laid on the table pending the acceptance of the report.

Bills, petitions, etc, presented and referred:

COUNTIES.

By Mr. Noble of Franklin—Remonstrance of the County Commissioners and others of Franklin county against setting off any portion of Franklin county and annexing same to Oxford county.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

Mr. White from the committee on the judiciary to which was referred, bill, An act to authorize the City of Lewiston to issue its bonds to the amount of \$185,000, to pay its bonds now outstanding and maturing in the year 1891, reported that same ought to pass. Report accepted. Bill tabled to be printed under the joint rules.

PASSED TO BE ENGROSSED.

Resolve for the purpose of operating fish hatcheries and feeding stations for tish and for the proper enforcement of the inland fish and game laws.

Bill, An act to abolish the fees and per diem compensation, and establish the salary of the stenographer of the Superior Court for the county of Kennebec.

On motion by Mr. Wilson of Washington the Senate adjourned.

JUDICIARY.

By Mr. Fuller of Kennebunk—Petition of L. Edgecomb and 10 others for an act against trading stamps.

By Mr. Gammon of Jay—Petition of the Oxford Baptist Quarterly meeting against excursion rates on the Sabbath day.

By Mr. Pattangall—Bill, an act to amend section 47 of chapter 77 of the Revised Statutes relating to the place of holding the April term of the S. J. court in the county of Washington.

LEGAL AFFAIRS.

By Mr. Andrews of Rockport—Bill, an act to supply the town of Camden with pure water.

Mr. Carleton of Winthrop moved that the bill be laid upon the table.

Mr. Plummer of Portland moved to amend the motion, that the bill he printed prior to its reference to a committee.

Mr. Carleton accepted the amendment, and the motion as amended prevailed.
